



- I. Untimely availability of external project funding from Commercial Banks due to factors beyond our control such as short period licensing of less than six months issued by SUMATRA and later on by TASAC for inland container businesses. You will recall that over suddenly these government agencies decided to shorter the licensing period without apparent reasons from four years in 2019 to renewal six months tenure which denied us trust from commercial banks for term loan of over three years and above. The project design had in mind a four years licensing period as per SUMTRA and TASAC Regulation.
- On October up to November, 2019 we lodged an official complain and in fact visited various Ministries for extension of our licenses to a longer duration as shown below:

- II. Frustration of project on the effect of Covid 19 as proven and attested by the Manufacturer of the imported 40 trucks whose certificate of incentives has been lodged for extension.
- We provided to your office an extract of official email correspondences from our Manufacturer in China who insisted that production of trucks were serious affected from December 2019 on occurrence of first incidence of Covid 19 pandemic.
- III. That the respective taxes including duties associated with 40 trucks as per approved TRA List were not budgeted for neither raised from commercial banks. These figures of taxes are very much significant if not rescued in term of extension of the said certificate of incentives will erode our working capital and thus lead to the total failure of the entire project. The project critical factors is based on

availability of trucks and trailers to the tune of seventy five percent (75%) equivalent to 75 trucks. The main project design was based on logistic industry.

IV. The economic benefit of extinction of the referred certificate of incentive will have great impact to the national in large if fully allowed to be implemented from the current stand still at start up stage to its maturity stage. As per business plan tabled to your good office the 75 trucks were predesigned to stand at start up stage whereby we are still at that stage.

The Project was specifically targeted to contribute to the Government Coffer the following economic benefits:

- Provides respective taxes to the tune of TZS 12.5 Billion for the next three years.
- Provide direct and indirect employments estimated at 6000 people.
- Increase horizontal investments on similar supportive projects like establishment of transshipment ship totaled TZS 10 Billion emanates from the existing project. These new ventures are estimated to contribute to the Government coffer in term of taxes to the tune of additional TZS 10.5 Billion as well as provide direct and indirect employment of about 1500 people.

Therefore we once again call for your personal intervention and institute an administrative review for extension of the said certificate of incentive which we have significant economic benefits not only to our Company but to the National in large as asserted above.

We believe you will timely intervene as 40 trucks have already docked in Dar es Salaam and started accumulating some storage charges which impaired beyond repair our existing working capital to the effect negates provision of good services to our existing and potential customers.

We beg to submit.
