OBJECTIVES

- (xiii) To institute and award fellowships, scholarships, studentship prizes and other aids to study and research; and
- (xiv) To safeguard and protect intellectual property rights on innovations and inventions emerging from the efforts of university in executing its mandate;

PROGRAMME OFFERED

Doctor of Medicine

Is a five-year, ten semesters competency-based programme. All the courses in the Programme have core status, implying that every student must register and pass all the courses; there is no elective course.

The first four semesters are largely devoted to basic sciences and introduction to clinical medicine, but also fieldwork community training.

The next six semesters are mainly practical and comprise junior and senior clerkships as well as community health training.

The University strives to bring on board programmes that will encounter the problem of shortage of skilled workforce due to mismatch of curricula used for institutional training and labour market skills requirement.

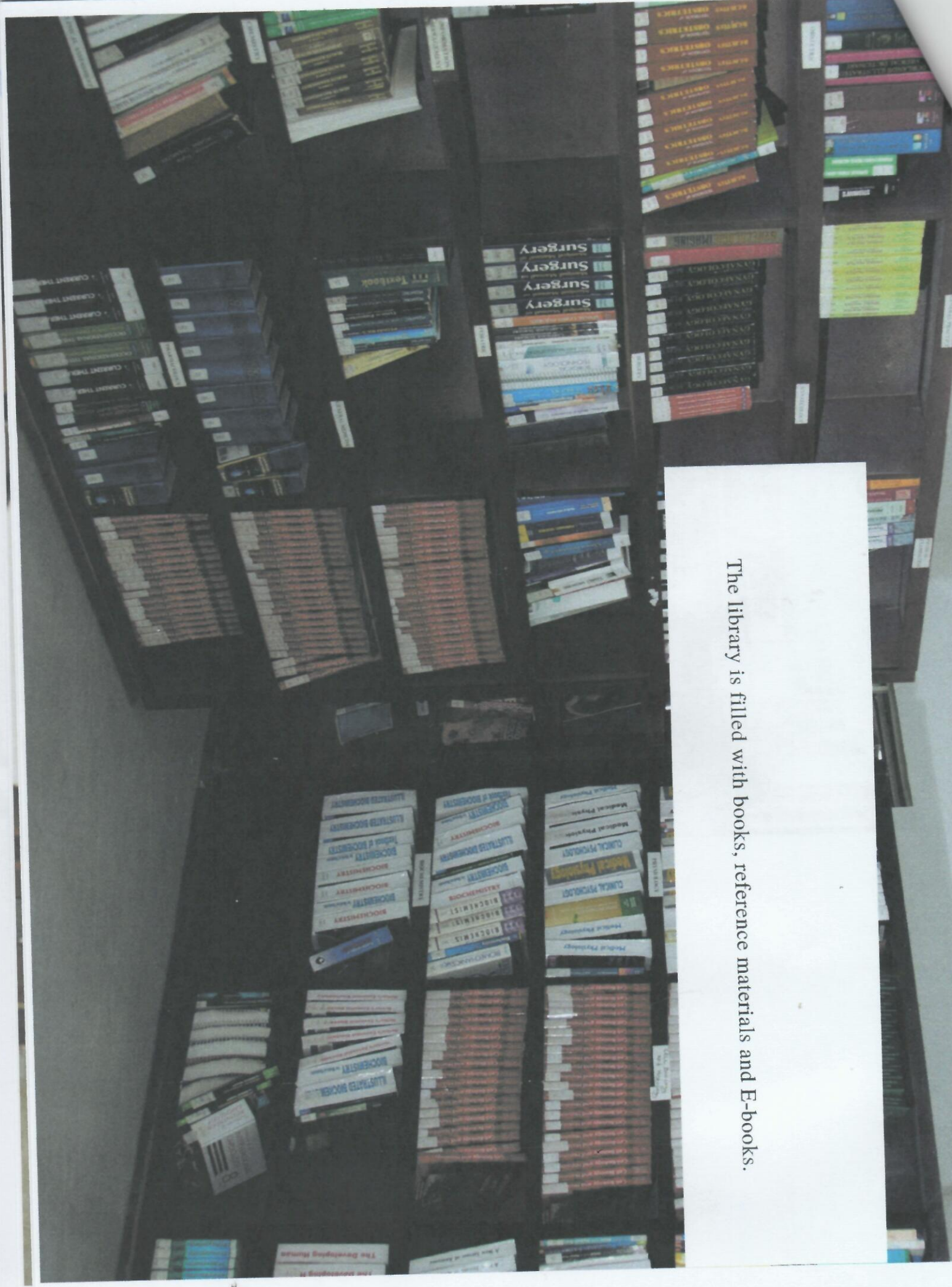

The library is filled with books, reference materials and E-books.

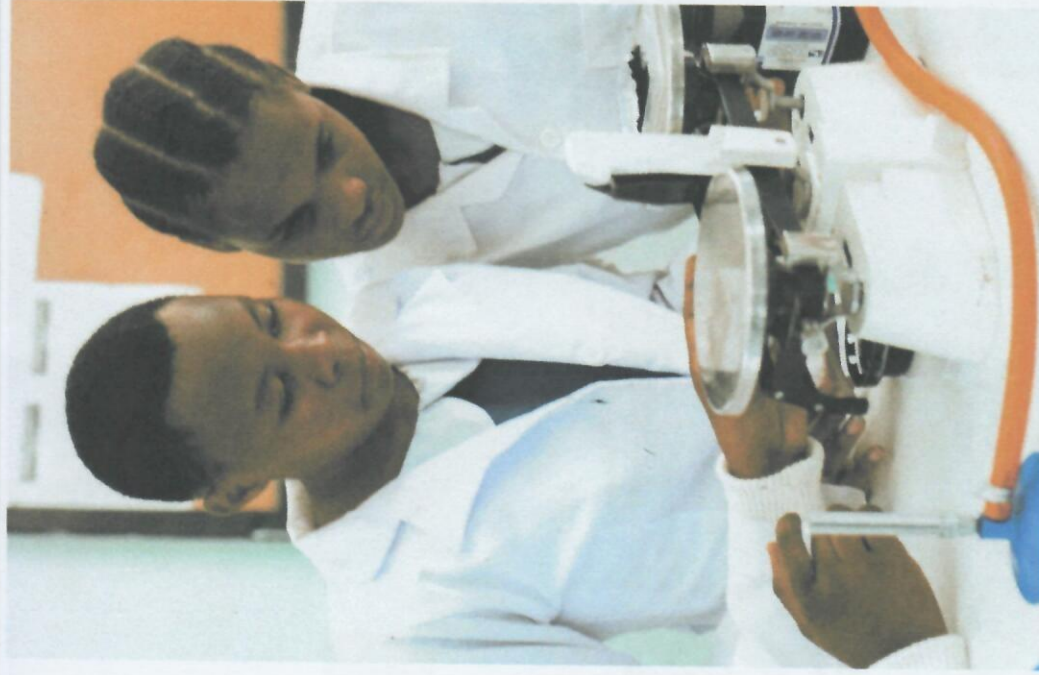
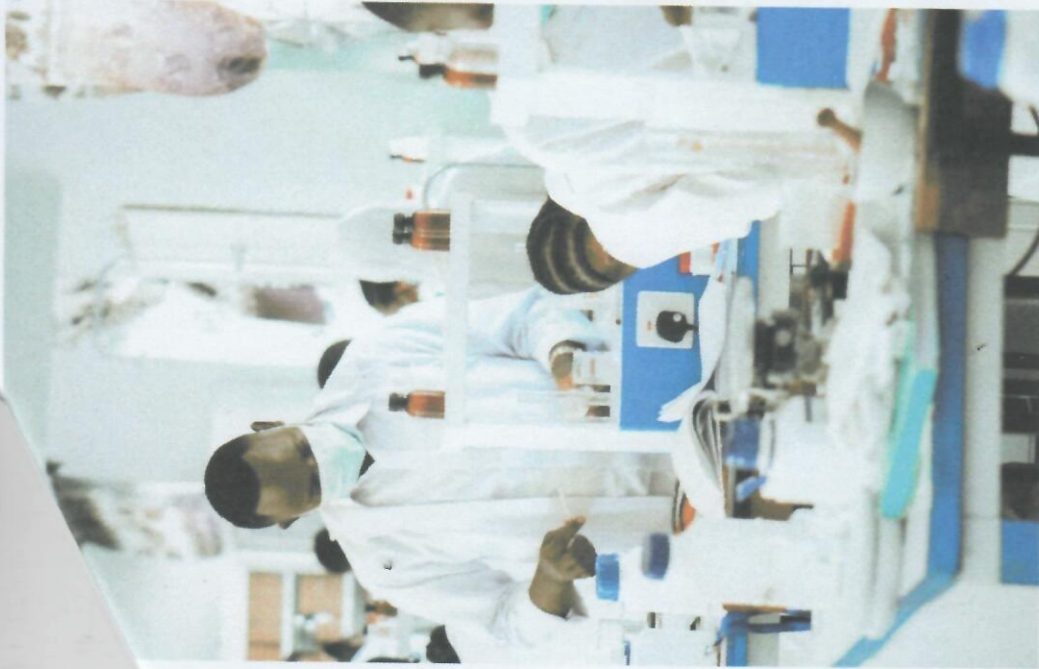
The Library is equipped with more than 20 computers that enables students to access E-books and online reading references

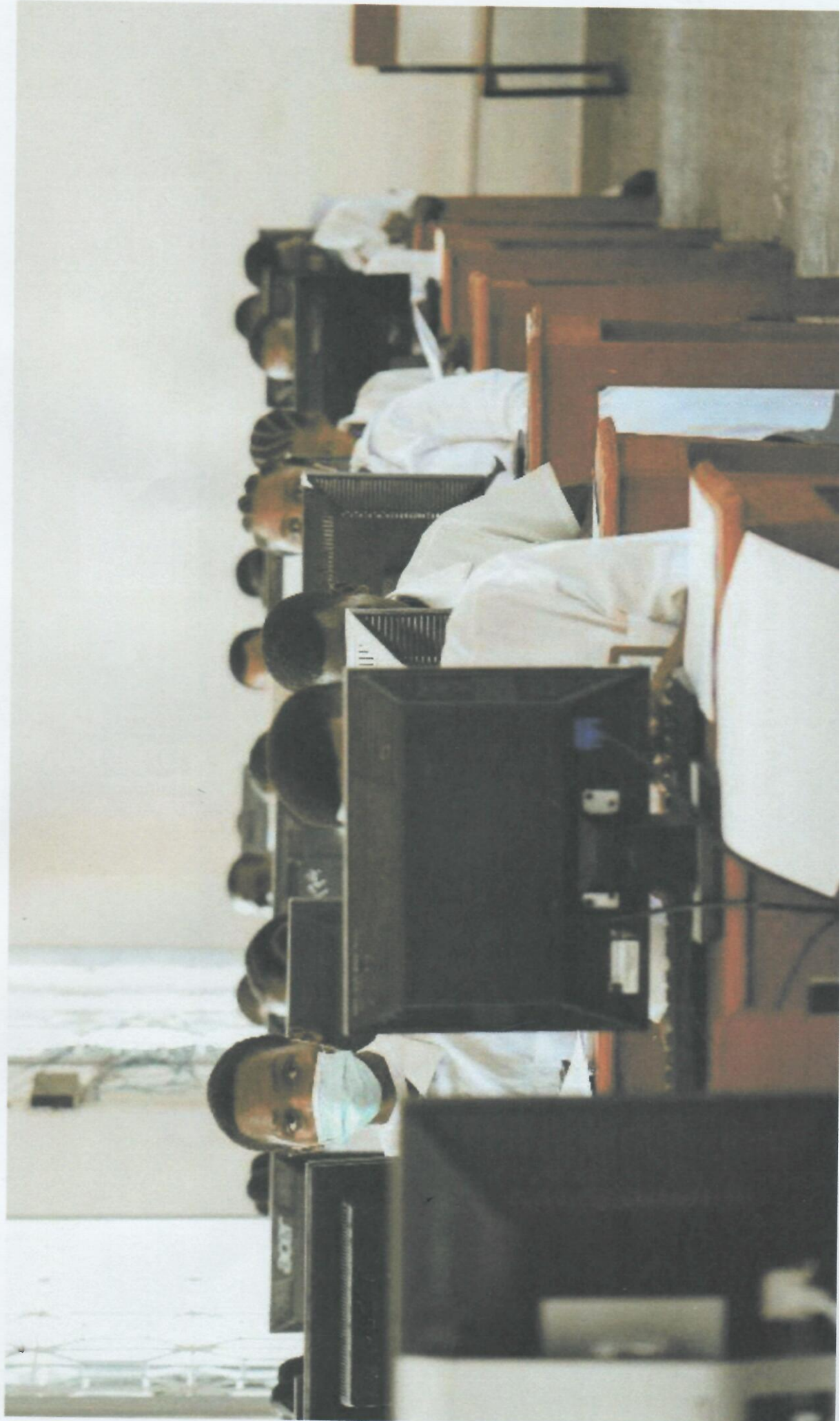


ANATOMY LABORATORY

COMPUTER LABORATORY

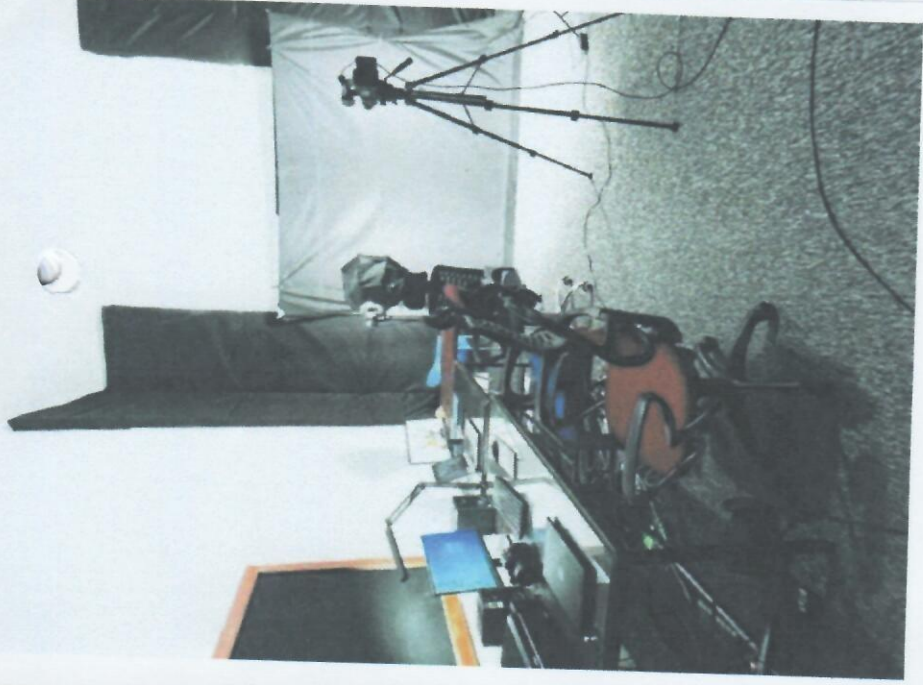
The computer lab at Mwanza University is furnished with more than fifty computers connected to the internet.

REGULATIONS

(Made under section 62)

THE UNIVERSITY (GENERAL) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 2023

Citation
GN No.
226 of 2013

1. These Regulations may be cited as the University (General) (Amendment) Regulations, 2023 and shall be read as one with the Universities (General) Regulations, 2013 herein referred to as the principal Regulations.

Amendment of
regulation 8

2. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 8 by deleting subregulation (3) and substituting for it the following-

“(3) A university which is granted a Provisional License in accordance with these regulations and has fulfilled all requirements for the provision of university education in Tanzania as required under the Act, may be allowed to advertise courses and select students for initial academic programs:

Provided that, the university shall not confer any academic and other awards unless it is granted accreditation in accordance with the provisions of the Act.”
