1. The name of the company is "NEERIKA HOLDING & GENERAL SUPPLY LIMITED"
2. The Registered office of the Company will be situated in Tanzania.
3. The objects for which the Company is established are:-
 - (a) To carry on the business as general suppliers of all sorts and types of products and services to individuals, offices, industries, shops, schools, factories, hospitals, army, military, ministries and all other government offices, universities and all other places where the services of a supplier are needed.
 - (b) To carry on the business of supplying of stationery, office equipment, writing materials, teaching aids and other educational establishment and as agents, school uniforms and stationers in all their business and to buy and sell stationery, office requirements and equipment, all types of books, sundry goods and to act as general merchants and commission agents of print and bind and manufacture stationers and other requirements.
 - (c) To carry on all or any business of publishing, printing, distributing and selling of business, management, industrial, scientific, academic, communications, financial, agricultural, social and environmental information technology periodicals, brochures and books and any other reading materials.
 - (d) To carry on the business of importers, exporters, buying selling, dealers in hardware, building materials, sanitary-ware, wall papers, roofing tiles, flooring tiles, supplying industrial equipment's agricultural implements and equipment's spares of every description, plumbers, decorators, steel fabrication, machine shop, nickel plating, electric plating, making steel windows, doors, frames and roof tresses.
 - (e) To carry on the business of miners and mining in all their branches and for the said purpose to peg, purchase, take on lease, or exchange or otherwise acquire concessions, grants, easements, options, claims, properties, cassettes- and effects supposed to contain minerals, diamonds, or other precious stones, and any interest therein, and to explore, mine, work, excise develop and turn to account mines and mining rights and any undertaking connected therewith.
 - (f) To carry on the business of mineral procuring and processing, mineral consultant, mining chemicals, to search for ores, minerals and previous stones, mine over any land in which the company may be interested and to sell or otherwise dispose of the land, mines, mineral precious stone and any other property of the company.
 - (g) To carry on the business as retailers, wholesale, exporters, buyers and sellers of all types of minerals and gemstones including gold, diamonds, coal, nickel, copper, aluminium, gemstones, found in the United Republic of Tanzania and to engage in exportation of rough, cut and polished minerals and gemstones including diamonds to different parts of the world and to open up landaries and to acquire mine workings and mining grounds in Tanzania.

- (h) To construct, erect, equip and carry on the business of petrol station with all usual or convenient buildings, petrol and oil pumps, plants, machinery, articles and things which may be required for purpose of the said business or commonly supplied or dealt with by persons engaged in such business, to carry on the business of garage proprietors, service proprietors, mechanical engineers, manufactures and repairs of motors cars, motor bodies and equipment and other machinery, general motor engineers, consulting and electrical engineers, welders, fitters, burners, toolmakers, metal workers, millwright, machinists, iron and steel converters, smiths, builders, painters and to buy, sell, manufacture, export, import, repair, convert, alter and let on hire and deal in motor cars and equipment, spare parts and accessories, machinery, implements, rolling stock and hardware and sanitary of all kinds, builder's materials, timber, oils, spirits, varnishes, electrical and electronic machinery and equipments.
- (i) To carry on the business of commission agents of all types of petroleum products ranging from crude/black oil to white/refined products such as gas, paraffin, petrol, kerosene, engine oils, gas-oil/diesel, oils and other lubricants, grease bitumen, petrochemical etc. and petroleum by – products; by providing a business link between the producer/suppliers and the buyers/customers within the country and elsewhere in the World, thus to initiate and conclude business negotiations/deals on their behalf.
- (j) To acquire, take over, promote, establish, engage in and carry the business of profession of farmers, planters, harvesters, sprayers, seed growers, glaziers breeders of and dealers of livestock, market gardeners, arboriculturists, agriculturalists, horticulturists, floriculturists, dairymen, vegetable oil extractors, poultry and bee-keepers and any other businesses in connection with floriculture, arboriculture agriculture and horticulture.
- (k) To carry and promote and trade or business of farm and agricultural chemicals, inputs, implements, tools, packaging materials and deal in the livestock and or the veterinary health care products to farmers and stockists, to sell, buy, supply, distribute whether in retail or wholesale farm implements and tools, chemicals, animals feeds, fertilizer, insecticides, fungicides, growth stimulants, agro seeds, veterinary drugs and any related goods and import and export agriculture and food technology, industries and equipment, manufacture and semi processed products in Tanzania and other parts of the world.
- (l) To carry on the business as general buyers, exporters of agricultural crops and products, such as coffee, tea, sisal, cotton, beans, cashewnuts, cereals, peanuts, cowpeas, yellow gramm green monks and to be general suppliers in local and export markets, to be general bakers and confectioners and generally to be traders and manufacturers of the above.
- (m) To engage and or carry on the business of general civil works, engineering, constructions, consultants, buildings, renovations, office partitioners, decoratories, maintainers of dilapidated buildings, plumbing, furniture manufactures, suppliers and exporters, residential and office furnishers and general to be designers and fabricators of all kinds of gadgets whatsoever, to be timber processors, sawmillers and suppliers of all kinds of timber, to be hardware and building materials suppliers, manufactures of electrical equipments and suppliers of same.
- (n) To carry on the business of building contractors, technical engineering, hiring construction equipment, masonry and general construction contractors and among other things to construct, execute, carry out, equip, improve, work and advertise railways, tramways, docks harbours, sharves, canals, water-courses, irrigations, reclamations, sewage, drainage and other sanitary works, water, gas, electric and other supply works, houses, building and erections of every kind.
- (o) To carry on the business as manufacturers, principals or agents representatives of importing, exporting, buying, selling, distributing of new and used motor vehicles, light and heavy duty vehicles, cars, trucks, lorries or other vehicles, motor vehicles spares and parts of all descriptions, railway, fuel and other oils, petroleum of all kinds, tyres and tubes, batteries, battery solution and other spares, accessories, motor cycles, bicycles, tractors, mining equipments, fishing gears,

- (o) To carry on the business as manufacturers, principals or agents representatives of importing, exporting, buying, selling, distributing of new and used motor vehicles, light and heavy duty vehicles, cars, trucks, lorries or other vehicles, motor vehicles spares and parts of all descriptions, railway, fuel and other oils, petroleum of all kinds, tyres and tubes, batteries, battery solution and other spares, accessories, motor cycles, bicycles, tractors, mining equipments, fishing gears.

agricultural and industrial machinery and equipments, new and second hand spare parts and accessories and generally to deal in all types of motor spare parts and industrial and agricultural machinery and parts, electronic goods and accessories thereof.

- (p) To carry on the business as importers, exporters, sellers, buyers, manufacturers of spare parts for different types of machines and instruments including motor vehicles, cars, trucks, lorries or other vehicles, bicycles, motor bikes, agricultural implements, mining implements and any other machinery, tool maker, metal workers, boil makers and any other kind of machine whatsoever.
- (q) To sale and distribute mobile phones and related accessories; to provide phone calls, fax, telex services and similar facilities and provide Internet and E-mail services.
- (r) To carry on the business as general traders, suppliers, merchants, stockists, wholesalers, retailers and dealers in all types of electrical goods, hardware, building materials, spare parts and maintainance, tyres, tubes, tools and accessories for all types of automotive, motor vehicles, agricultural machinery, implements, equipment, all kinds of industrial projects machinery and equipment, timber, fishing gears, groceries, computers, office equipments, cooking oils, foodstuffs, cosmetics, oils, paints, spirits sheets, hinges, screws, iron mongery, textiles piece goods, all types of leather goods, shoes, bags and other similar goods.
- (s) To engage in investment scheme for construction, rehabilitation, erection, ownership and management of commercial buildings, export processing zones and special economic zones, to buy, sell, hire, manufacture, trade, and deal in property, goods, produce, articles, and merchandise of all kinds and transact any and every description as development agency, distribution, marketing, commercial, industrial, manufacturing, mercantile, insurance and financial business and carry on the business of traders, general merchants, general storekeepers, metals, commission agents, business consultants, market research consultants, business transfer agents, company promoters, underwriters, financiers and bill brokers, del-credere agents, barter traders, court brokers, auctioneers and generally to execute and undertake agencies of all kind or carry on the business of warehouse construction, landscaping, engineering, general civil works and deal in all kinds of scrap metal and precious metals.
- (t) To carry on the business of general merchants, general store-keepers, universal providers, importers, exporters, suppliers, wholesale and/or retail traders, dealers of piecewood, paints, hardware, glassware, crockery, cutlery, ironmongery, turners and other household fittings and requirements, other articles and commodities of personal, household use and consumption provisions, textiles, groceries, medicines, drugs, wines, spirits, liquors, chemical, surgical, option, photographic and other instruments, apparatus and materials, motor vehicles, automobiles and generally in all manufactured goods of all types and merchandise of all kinds.
- (u) To carry on all or any of the business of transport, carriage and haulage contractors, owners and charter of road vehicles, aircraft and ships and boats of every description and carriers of goods and passenger by road, rail, water or air and to establish, acquire, maintain and operate transport service of every description both public and private and all services ancillary thereto and for such purposes or as independent undertakings to purchase, take in exchange, charter, hire, build, contract or otherwise acquire and to own, operate, work, manage, maintain, repair, service and deal with and in road vehicles, aircraft and vessels of every supplies therefore and to conduct any such business within the country or any other state in Africa or Europe or Asia and or any other foreign country.
- (v) To carry on the business of dealing in importing, exporting, marketing, manufacturing stocking, buying, selling whether by wholesale or retail of various categories of goods and merchandise, and to act as insurance agents, commission agents, brokers and manufacturers, representatives in all fields. To be agent of foreign company and to establish business enterprises whether small scale, industries and generally deal in all kinds of general merchants and to import, export and all either by merchandise and articles of all description.

- (w) To promote tourism in Tanzania and elsewhere in Africa, to carry on business of travel and tourist agents and tour operators, car hire, hotel bookings, promote facilitate traveling to organise hunting, tented-camps, fishing and diving expeditions, safari promoters and undertakers generally and in particular to arrange and manager hunting safaris, photo safaris adventure tours, fishing trips, handling of game trophies and animal skins, catching, harbouring, transporting, wildlife and marine products of all kind.
- (x) To engage in and carry out the business of proprietors and managers of food outlet, hotels, restaurants, cafes, road houses, motels, safari and holiday camps, caravan sites, guest houses, apartment housekeepers, refreshment and tea rooms, milk and snacks bars, tavern, beer house and lodging housekeepers and to provide food and catering services to individuals, private and public institutions and to industrial and business concerns.
- (y) To carry on the business of traders, manufacturers, and of proprietors, promoters, financiers, concessionaires, commercial agents and advisers of and for commercial, industrial, agricultural products, agricultural equipments, agro chemicals, all general trading, forestry fishery, mining, transport, housing, entertainment, hotel, restaurant and financial undertakings and enterprises, and in particular, but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing to act as consultants, general agents, financial agents and technical advisers to and for any such undertaking or enterprises as aforesaid.
- (z) To carry on the business and act as managers of investments and investment company, real estate agents, property managers, developers, valuers, decorators, engineers and to generally be able to carry out activities of any description with regards to land, property and real estate, investment in any type of property, buildings, lands, securities, bonds, shares and any property act as a holding company with subsidiaries and invest in any projects as the company may think fit.
- (aa) To carry on the business of wholesalers, retailers, general traders, suppliers, merchants, importers, exporters, stockists and dealers in all types of selling second hand clothing, used and new shoes, new clothes and shoes, belt, textile materials, tie and dye, boutique, bags, flowers, dresses of types and description whatsoever.
- (bb) To carry on the business of household, domestic appliance and electrical goods, audio visual goods, electronic items, building material, hardwares, foodstuff, agricultural products and merchandise of every nature, kind and description whatsoever as a dealer, wholesaler, retailer, distributor, importer, exporter and after sales service and repairing.
- (cc) To carry on the business of fumigators, vacuum cleaners, steam cleaners, carpet cleaners, window shop, officer, club hotel, theatre cleaners vermin and insects destroyers and generally to undertake cleaning and fumigation of any kind.
- (dd) To engage in and or otherwise carry on the business of environmental protection and management, financial management, sanitary services, super cleaners, removal treatment contractors, rural, urban and community centers cleaners, landscapers to be professional sanitary services contractors, promoters of health services in governmental departments, offices, companies, public or private institutions, individual and any other organization all over the world.
- (ee) To carry on the business of establishing and running shops, shopping malls, provision stores, supermarkets, department stores, groceries food and shops of all kinds and description and generally to deal with such activities.
- (ff) To carry on the business as general food processors, packers, to be general suppliers of foods stuffs and agricultural crops, grain millers, food mixers, general exporters of fresh fruits, vegetables and flowers, to act as agents of buying and selling all kinds of food stuffs, agricultural equipments of every description, and generally to deal in any other business connected therewith.

- (gg) To carry on the business of agents, consultants or representatives of foreign or local manufacturers, industries or other like organizations in any type of goods, products, commodities and services.
- (hh) To carry on the business of financial and managerial consultants and to act as managers, advisors and consultants in the field of accountancy, auditing business management and in any other business which may be useful carried in conjunction therewith.
- (ii) To carry on the business of marketing, services, consultancy and selling of all types of information technologies, computer systems, conference systems, telecommunication systems, security systems, public address systems, data communication and to train, research, install and after sale services of electronic systems, voice and data networks and any other systems or components which the company may think fit, necessary or incidental to this business.
- (jj) To purchase or acquire freehold, leasehold or other immovable property and movable property generally and also rights, privileges and easements over or in respect of any property movable or immovable, and to pay for the same in cash or in any other manner agreed upon, and to take over and assume liabilities for payments of all moneys owing whatsoever under and by virtue of any mortgages, charges or other existing and charged upon any and all such property as may be purchased at any time by the Company from any Government, person, firm or company and to do all things and execute such documents and deeds as may be necessary to that end.
- (kk) To advance money to any person or persons or corporations, either with or without interest upon the security of freehold or leasehold property by way of mortgage, or upon marketable security and in particular to advance money to shareholders in the company, and others, upon the security of or for the purpose of enabling the person borrowing the same to effect or purchase, or enlarge or repair any house of building or to purchase the free simple or any term or terms of years of any property in Tanzania, or elsewhere upon such terms, and conditions as the Company may think fit.
- (ll) To purchase, take on lease and otherwise acquire for investment or resale any estate, land, buildings, easements and other rights and interests in immovable property or any tenure in Tanzania and elsewhere and to sell let or lease exchange or otherwise dispose of or grant rights over any immovable property, belong to the company.
- (mm) To purchase, take or lease or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire and hold any state or interest in any lands buildings, casements, rights, licenses secret processes, machinery, plants, stock, in trade and real or personal property of any kind.
- (nn) To accept payment for any property or rights sold or otherwise disposed or dealt with by the company either in cash, by installment or otherwise or in fully or partly paid up shares of the company or corporation, with or without deferred or preferred or guaranteed rights.
- (oo) To carry any other trade or business whatever which can in the opinion of the Board of Directors be advantageously carried on by the Company in connection with the above business or the general business of the company.
- (pp) To act as agents for the sale and purchase of any stocks shares or securities or for any other monetary or mercantile transactions.
- (qq) To act as executors and trustees of wills and settlements made by customers and others and undertake and execute trusts of all kinds.
- (rr) To do all or any of the above things in any part of the world and either as principals, agents, trustees, contractors or otherwise, and either alone or in conjunction with others and either or though agents, sub-contractors, trustees and otherwise.

- (ss) To remunerate any person, firm or company rendering services to this company, whether by cash payments or by allotment to him or them of shares or securities of the Company credited and paid in full or in part, otherwise.
- (tt) To accept for safe custody and keep for customers of the company all kinds of securities valuables and things.
- (uu) To lend money on any terms that may thought fit, and particularly to customers or other person or corporations having dealing with societies and to give any guarantees that may be expedient.
- (vv) To advance money to shareholders in the company, and other to the purpose of enabling the person borrowing the same erect or purchase, or enlarge or repair any house or building or to purchase the fee simple or any less estate or interest in, or to take a demise for any term or terms of years of any freehold or leasehold property upon such terms and conditions as the company may think fit.
- (ww) To invest and deal with the moneys of the Company not immediately required, upon such securities and in such manner as may from time to time be determined.
- (xx) To distribute among the members in pieces any property of the company, or any proceeds of sale or disposal of any property of the company.
- (yy) To draw, make, accept, endorse, discount execute and issue promissory notes, bills of lading, warrants, debentures and negotiable or transferable instruments.
- (zz) To act as agents or brokers, and as trustees for any person firm or company, and to undertake and perform sub-contracts and also to act in any other business of the company through or by means of agents, brokers, sub-contractors or others.
- (aaa) To obtain any provisional order, ordinance or act of Parliament for enabling the Company to carry any of it is objects into effect, or for affecting any modification of the Company's constitution, or any other purpose which may seem expedient, and to oppose any proceedings or applications which may seem calculated, directly or indirectly to prejudice the company's interest.
- (bbb) To take or otherwise and hold shares in any other company having objects altogether or in part similar to this company, or carrying on any business capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit the company.
- (ccc) To transact or carry on all kinds of Agency business and in particular in relation to the investment of money, the sale of property, and the collection and receipt of money.

That the meaning of any general word or words in any paragraph of this clause shall not be restricted by being construed ejusdem generis with any particular word or words in the same paragraph.

4. The Liability of the Members is Limited.
5. The capital of the Company is Shillings 30,000,000/= divided into 1,000 shares of Shillings 30,000/= each.

The Company shall have powers to increase its capital and to divide the shares in its capital for the time being into several classes of stock or shares and to attach thereto respectively such preferential, deferred or special rights, privileges, or conditions as may be determined by or in accordance with the Articles of Association of the Company.

TABLE A EXCLUDE

1. The regulations in Table A in the First Schedule to the Company Act 2002 shall not apply to the Company, except so far as the same are repeated or contained in these Articles.

INTERPRETATION

In these Articles, unless the subject or context otherwise requires, the words standing in the first column of the table next hereinafter contained shall bear the meanings set opposite to them respectively in the second column thereof:

WORDS AND MEANINGS

"Articles": these Articles of Association as originally framed or as altered from time to time by Special Resolution;

"A Shareholder": any holder from time to time of the Shares;

"The Directors": the directors for the time being of the Company present at a duly convened meeting of the directors at which a quorum is present;

"The Office": the registered office for the time being of the Company;

"The Act": the Companies Act 2002 and every statutory modification and re-enactment thereof for the time being in force;

2. The Company is a Private Company and accordingly; no invitation or offer shall be made to the public (whether for cash or otherwise) to subscribe for any shares in or debentures of the Company, nor shall the Company allot or agree to allot (whether for cash or otherwise) any shares in or debentures of the Company with a view to all or any of those shares or debentures being offered for sale to the public.

The Company may pay to any person a commission in consideration of his subscribing or agreeing to subscribe, whether absolute or conditional, for any shares in the Company: provided that such commission shall not exceed 10 per cent of the price at which such shares are issued, or an amount equivalent to such percentage; and the requirements of Section 56 of the Act shall be observed.

3. a. The Directors may subject to Article 48 hereof allot, grant options over, or otherwise deal with or dispose of any relevant securities of the Company in accordance with the provisions of these Articles and the Act to such persons and generally on such terms and conditions as the Directors think proper.

- b. The general authority conferred by paragraph (a) of this article shall be conditional upon due compliance with Article 48 hereof and shall extend to the amount of the authorized share capital of the Company upon its incorporation.
- c. The Directors shall be entitled under the general authority conferred by paragraph (a) of this Article to make at any time before the expiry of such authority any offer or agreement which will or might require relevant securities of the Company to be allotted after the expiry of such authority.

4. If two or more persons are registered as joint holders of any share, any one of such persons may give effectual receipts for any dividends or other moneys payable in respect of such share.
5. No person shall be recognized by the Company as holding any share upon any trust, and the Company shall not be bound by or required to recognize and equitable, contingent, future or partial interest in any share or any right whatsoever in respect of any share other than an absolute right to the entirety thereof in the registered holder, except as by these Articles otherwise expressly provide or as required by law.

Without prejudice to any special rights previously conferred on the holders of any existing shares or class of shares, any share in the capital of the Company may be issued with such preferred, deferred or other special rights or such restrictions, whether in regard to dividend, voting, return of capital or otherwise as the Company may from time to time by ordinary resolution determine.
8. Subject to the provisions of Companies Act 2002, any preference shares may, with the sanction of an ordinary resolution, be issued on the terms that they are, or at the option of the Company are liable to be redeemed on such terms and in such manner as the Company before the issue of the shares may by Special Resolution determine.
9. The rights conferred upon the holders of the shares of any class issued with preferred or other rights shall unless otherwise expressly provided by the terms of issue of the shares of that class, be deemed not to be varied by the creation or issued of further shares ranking pari-passu therewith.
10. If at any time the share capital is divided into different classes of shares, the rights attached to any class (unless otherwise provided by the terms of issue of the shares of that class) may be varied with the consent in writing of the holders of the three fourths of the issued shares of that class, or with the sanction of an extraordinary resolution passed at a separate general meeting of the holders of the shares of that class. To every such separate meeting the provisions of this articles relating to general meetings shall mutatis mutandis apply, but so that the necessary quorum shall be two persons at least holding or representing by proxy one-third of the issued shares of the class and that any holder of shares of the class present in person or by proxy may demand a poll.
11. Every person whose name is entered as member in the register of members shall, without payment, be entitled to one certificate under the common seal of the Company specifying the share or shares held by him and the amount paid up thereon, provided that in respect of a share or shares held jointly by several persons the Company shall be bound to issue only one certificate.

certificate, and delivery of certificate of a share to one of several jointly holders shall be sufficient delivery to all.

12. If a share certificate is defaced, lost, or destroyed, it may be renewed on payment of such fee, if any, not exceeding one hundred shillings, and on such terms, if any, as to evidence and indemnity as the directors think fit.

LIEN

13. The Company shall have a lien on every share for all moneys (whether present payable or not) called or payable at a fixed time in respect of that share, and the Company shall also have a lien on all shares standing registered in the name of a single person for all moneys presently payable by him or his estate to the Company; but the directors may at any time declare any share to be wholly or in part exempt from the provisions of this article. The Company's lien, if any on a share shall extend to all dividends payable thereon.
14. The Company may sell, in such manner as the directors thin fit, any shares on which the Company has a lien, but no sale shall be made unless some sum in respect of which the lien exists is presently payable, nor until the expiration of fourteen days after a notice in writing, stating and demanding payment of such part of the amount in respect of which the lien exists as is presently payable, has been given to the registered holder for the time being of the share, or the person entitled by reason of his death or bankruptcy to the share.
15. For giving effect to any such sale the directors may authorise some person to transfer the share sold to the purchaser thereof. The purchaser shall be registered as the holder of the shares comprised in any such transfer and he shall not be found to see to the application of the purchaser money, nor shall his title to the shares be affected by any irregularity or invalidity in the proceedings in reference to the sale.
16. The proceeds of sale shall be applied in payment of such part of the amount in respect of which the lien exists as is presently payable, and the residue shall be held (subject to a like lien for sums not presently payable as existed upon the shares prior to the sale) by the Company on behalf of the person entitled to the shares at the date of the sale.

CALLS ON SHARES

17. The directors may from time to time make calls upon the members in respect of any moneys unpaid on their shares, and each member shall (subject to receiving at least fourteen days notice specifying the time or times of payment) pay to the Company at the time or times of specified the amount called in his shares. A call shall be deemed to have been made at the time when the resolution of the directors authorising the call was passed.
18. The joint holders of a share shall be jointly and severally liable to pay all calls in respect hereof.
19. If sum called in respect of a share is not paid before or on the date appointed for payment thereof, the person from whom the sum is due shall pay interest upon the sum at bank rate prevailing from time to time from the day appointed for payment thereof to the time of actual payment, but the directors shall be at liberty waive payment of the interest wholly or in part.
20. The provisions of these articles as to the liability of joint holders and as to payment of interest shall apply in the case of non-payment of any sum which, by the terms of issue of share, becomes payable at a fixed time, whether on account of the amount of the share, or by way of premium, as if the same has become payable by virtue of a call duly made and notified.
21. The directors may make arrangements on the issue of shares for a difference between the holders in the amount of calls to be paid and in the times of payment.

22. The directors may, if they think fit, receive from any member willing to advance the same all or any part of the moneys uncalled and unpaid upon any shares held by him; and upon all or any of the moneys so advanced may (until the same would, but for such advance, become presently payable) pay interest at such rate (not exceeding, without the sanction of any Company in general meeting, the bank rate existing from time to time as may be agreed upon between the member paying the sum in advance and the directors).

TRANSFER AND TRANSMISSION

23. Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained shares in the Company shall be transferable by written instrument in the common form signed by both the transferor and transferee, and the transferor shall be deemed to remain the holder of the share until the name of the transferee is entered in the register of members in respect thereof.
24. The directors may in their absolute discretion and without assigning any reason therefore decline to register any transfer of shares to any person whom they do not approve not being already a member of the Company and may also decline to register any transfer of shares on which the Company has lien. The directors may also suspend the registration of transfers during the fourteen days immediately preceding the ordinary general meeting in each year. The directors may decline to recognize any instrument of transfer unless:-
- (a) A fee not exceeding shillings two hundred and fifty is paid to the Company in respect thereof; and
 - (b) The instrument of transfer is accompanied by the certificate of the shares to which it relates, and such other evidence as the directors may reasonably require to show the right of the transferor to make the transfer.

If the directors refuse to register a transfer of any shares, they shall within two months after the date on which the transfer was lodged with the Company send to the transferee notice of the refusal.

25. The personal representatives of a deceased sole holder of share shall be the only persons recognized by the Company as having any title to the share. In the case of share registers in the names of two or more holders, the survivors or survivor, or the personal representatives of the deceased survivor, shall be the only persons recognized by the Company as having any title to the share.
26. Any person becoming entitled to a share in consequence of the death or bankruptcy of a member shall, upon such evidence being produced as may from time to time be required by the directors, have the right, either to be registered as a member in respect of the share or, instead of being registered himself, to make such transfer of share as the deceased or bankrupt person could have made; but the directors shall, in either case, have the same right to decline or suspend registration as they would have had in the case of transfer of the share by the deceased or bankrupt person before the death or bankruptcy.
27. Except as hereinafter provided no share in the Company shall be transferred unless and until the rights of pre-emption hereinafter conferred shall have been exhausted.
28. Every member or other person referred to in article 26 hereof who intends to transfer shares (hereinafter called the vendor) shall give notice in writing to the board of his intention. The notice shall constitute the board his agent for the sale of the said shares in one or more lots at the discretion of the board to members of the Company at a price to be agreed upon by the vendor and the board, and in default of agreement, at a price which the auditor of the Company for the time being shall certify, by writing under his hand, to be in his opinion, the fair selling value thereof as between a willing vendor and a willing purchaser.

29. Upon the price being fixed as aforesaid the board shall forthwith give notice to all the members of the Company other than holders of employees' shares of the number and price of the shares to be sold and invite each of them to state in writing within twenty-one days from the date of the said notice whether he is willing to purchase any, and if so, what maximum number, of the said shares.
30. At the expiration of the said twenty-one days the board shall allocate the said shares to or among the member or members who shall have expressed his or their willingness to purchase as aforesaid, and (if more than one) so far as may be pro rata according to the number of shares already held by them respectively, provided that no member shall be obliged to take more than the said maximum number of shares so notified by him as aforesaid. Upon such allocation being made the vendor shall bound on payment of the said price to transfer the shares to the purchaser or purchasers. If he make default in so doing the chairman for the time being of the directors of the Company or failing him one of the directors duly nominated by resolution of the board for that purpose shall forthwith be deemed to be duly appointed attorney of the vendor with full power to execute complete and deliver in the name and on behalf of the vendor a transfer of the shares to the purchasing member and the board may receive and give a good discharge for the purchase-money on behalf of the vendor and enter the name of the purchaser in the register of members as holder by transfer of the shares purchased by him.
31. In the event of the whole of the said shares not being purchased under article 28 the vendor may, at any time within six calendar months after the expiration of the said twenty-one days, transfer the shares not sold to any person (subject to article 17) and at any price.
32. Articles 25, 26, 27, 28 and 29 hereof shall not apply to a transfer to a person who is already a member of the Company, nor to a transfer merely for the purpose of effecting the appointment of new trustees, nor to a transfer by personal representatives to a legatee under the will of, or to the husband, wife or next of kin of, a deceased member, nor to a transfer by trustee to a beneficiary, provided that it is proved to the satisfaction of the board that the transfer bona fide falls within one of these exceptions.

FORFEITURE OF SHARES AND EXPROPRIATION OF SMALL HOLDINGS

33. If a member fails to pay any call or installment of a call, on the day appointed for payment thereof, the directors may at any time thereafter during such time as any part of such call or installment remains unpaid, serve a notice on him requiring payment of so much of the call or installment as is unpaid, together with any interest which may have accrued.
34. The notice shall name a further day (not earlier than the expiration of fourteen days from the date of the notice) on or before which the payment required by the notice is to be made, and shall state that in the event of non-payment at or before the time appointed the shares in respect of which the call was made will be liable to be forfeited.
35. If the requirements of any such notice as aforesaid are not complied with, any share in respect of which the notice has been given may at any time thereafter, before the payment required by the notice has been made, be forfeited by a resolution of the directors to that effect and such forfeiture shall extend to any dividends in respect of any share so forfeited not actually paid at the date of the said notice.
36. A forfeited share may be sold or otherwise disposed of on such terms and in such manner as the directors think fit, and at any time before a sale or disposition the forfeiture may be cancelled on such terms as the directors think fit.
37. A person whose shares have been forfeited shall cease to be a member in respect of the forfeited shares, but shall notwithstanding, remain liable to pay to the Company all moneys which, at the date of the forfeiture, were presently payable by him to the Company in respect of the shares, but

his liability shall cease if and when the Company receive payment in the full of the nominal amount of the shares.

38. The holders for the time being of four-fifths of the issued shares in the Company shall be entitled at any time to purchase ex dividend all or any of the shares held by any member of the Company at a price equal to the sum paid up thereon and upon the tender of that price by the holders of four-fifths of the issued shares to any other member for the shares held by him that member shall execute transfer of the shares to the members by whom the tender is made or their nominees in such shares and proportions as they shall direct. If the member to whom the tender is made neglects or refuses to accept the sum tendered or to execute transfers of the shares the Company may on proof of his neglect or refusal accept and give a good discharge for the moneys tendered on behalf of the member to whom the same shall have been tendered, and the provisions of article 23 shall apply to the execution of transfer of the shares and the registration of the members by whom the tender was made or their nominees as owners of the said shares.
39. A statutory declaration in writing that declarant is a director of the Company, and that a share in the Company has been duly forfeited or expropriated on a date sated in the declaration, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated as against all persons claiming to be entitled to the share. The Company may receive the consideration, if any, given for the share on any sale or disposition thereof and may execute a transfer of the share in favor of the person to whom the share is sold or disposed of and he shall thereupon be registered as the holder of the share, and shall not be bound to see to the application of the purchase-money, if any, nor shall his title to the share be affected by any irregularity or invalidity in the proceedings in reference to the forfeiture or expropriation, sale or disposal of the share.
40. The provisions of these articles as to forfeiture shall apply in the case of non-payment of any sum which, by terms of issue of share, becomes payable at a fixed time, whether on account of the amount of the share, or by way of premium, as if the same had been payable by virtue of a call duly made and notified.

ALTERATION OF CAPITAL

41. The Company may, from time to time by ordinary resolution increase the share capital by such sum, to be divided into shares of such amount, as the resolution shall prescribe.
42. Subject to any direction to the contrary that may be given by the resolution sanctioning the increase of share capital, all new shares shall, before issue, be offered to such persons as at the date of the offer are entitled to receive notices from the Company of general meetings in proportion, as nearly as the circumstances admit, to the amount of the existing shares to which they are entitled. The offer shall be made by notice specifying the number of shares offered, and limiting a time within which the offer, if not accepted, will be deemed to be declined, and after the expiration to that time, or on receipt of an intimation from the person to whom the offer is made that he declines to accept the shares offered, the directors may dispose of the same in such manner as they think most beneficial to the Company. The directors may likewise so dispose of any new shares which (by reason of the ratio which the new shares bear to shares held by persons entitled to an offer of new shares cannot, in the opinion of the director, be conveniently offered under this article.
43. The new shares shall be subject to the same provisions with reference to payment of calls, lien, transfer, transmission, forfeiture, expropriation, and otherwise as the shares in the original share capital.
44. The Company may by ordinary resolution:-
- (a) Consolidate and divide all or any of its share capital into shares of larger amount than its existing shares;

- (b) Sub-divide its existing shares, or any of them, into shares of smaller amount than is fixed by the memorandum of association, subject, nevertheless, to the Companies Act.
- (c) Cancel any shares which, at the date of the passing of the resolution, have not been taken or agreed to be taken by any person; and may by special resolution:-
- (d) Reduce its share capital and any capital redemption reserve fund in any manner and with, and subject to, any incident authorized, and consent, required, by law.

GENERAL MEETINGS

- 45. The Company shall in each year hold a general meeting as its annual general meeting in addition to any other meetings in that year, and shall specify the meeting as such in the notices calling it, and not more than fifteen months shall elapse between the date of one annual general meeting and that of the next. Provided that so long as the Company holds its first annual general meeting within eighteen months of its incorporation, it need not hold it in the year of its incorporation or in the following year. The annual general meeting shall be held at such time and at such place as the directors shall appoint.
- 46. All general meeting other than the annual general meeting shall be called extraordinary general meetings.
- 47. The directors may, whenever they think fit, convene an extraordinary general meeting. If at any time there are not within the united republic of Tanzania sufficient directors capable of acting to form a quorum, any director or any one member of the Company may convene an extraordinary general meeting in the same manner as nearly as possible as that in which meetings may be convened by the directors.

PROCEEDINGS AT GENERAL MEETINGS

- 48. An annual general meeting and a meeting called for the passing of special resolution shall be called by twenty-one days' notice in writing at the least, and all other meetings by fourteen days' notice in writing at least. Such notice shall be exclusive of the day on which it is served or deemed to be served and of the day for which it is given and shall specify the place, the day, and the hour of meeting and, in case of special business, the general nature of the business shall be given in the manner hereinafter mentioned, or in such other manner, if nay, as may be prescribed by Company in general meeting to such persons as are, under these articles, entitled to receive such notices from the Company; but with the consent of all the members entitled to receive notice of some particular meeting, that meeting may be convened by such shorter notice and in such manner as those members may think fit.
- 49. The accidental omission to give notice to, or the non-receipt of notice of a meeting by, any member shall not invalidate the proceedings at any meetings.
- 50. All business shall deemed special that is transacted at an extraordinary general meeting, and all that is transacted at an annual general meeting, with the exception of sanctioning a dividend, the consideration of the accounts and balance sheet and the ordinary report of the directors and auditors, the election of directors in the place of those retiring by rotation, and the appointment and fixing of the remuneration of the directors.
- 51. No business shall be transacted at any general meeting unless a quorum of members is present at the time when the meeting proceeds to business; same as herein otherwise provided two members personally present shall be a quorum.
- 52. If within half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting a quorum is not present, the meeting, if convened upon the requisition of members, shall be dissolved; in any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week, at the same time and place, and, if at the adjourned

53. The chairman, if any, of the board of directors shall preside as chairman at every general meeting of the Company.
54. If there is no such chairman, or if at any meeting he is not present within fifteen minutes after the time appointed for holding the meeting or is unwilling to act as chairman, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be chairman.
55. The chairman may, with the consent of any meeting at which a quorum is present (and shall if so directed by the meeting), adjourn the meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place. When a meeting is adjourned for thirty days or more, notice of the adjourned meeting shall be given as in the case of an original meeting. Save as aforesaid it shall not be necessary to give any notice of an adjournment or of the business to be transacted at an adjourned meeting.
56. At any general meeting a resolution put to the vote of the meeting shall be decided on a show of hands, unless a poll is (before or on the declaration of the result of the show of hands) demanded by at least one member entitled to vote present in person or by proxy; and unless a poll is so demanded, a declaration by the chairman that the resolution has, on a show of hands, been carried, or carried unanimously, or by particular majority, or lost, and an entry to that effect in the minute book shall be conclusive evidence of the fact, without proof of the number or proportion of the votes recorded in favor of, or against the resolution.
57. If a poll is duly demanded it shall be taken in such manner as the chairman directs, and the result of the poll shall be deemed to be a resolution of the meeting at which the poll was demanded.
58. In the case of an equality of votes, whether on a show of hands or on a poll, the chairman of the meeting at which the show of hands takes place, or at which the poll is demanded, shall be entitled to a second or casting vote.
59. A poll demanded on the election of a chairman, or in a question of adjournment, shall be taken forthwith. A poll demanded on any other question shall be taken at such time as the chairman of the meeting directs.
60. Any ordinary resolution of the Company determined on without any general meeting and evidenced by writing under the hands of all the directors or a sole director and of members of the Company holding three-fourths of the issued shares of the Company shall be as valid and effectual as an ordinary resolution duly passed at a general meeting of the Company duly convened and held.

VOTES OF MEMBERS

61. On a show of hands every member present in person shall have one vote. On a poll every member shall have one vote for each share of which he is the holder.
62. In the case of joint holders the vote of the senior who tenders a vote, whether in person or by proxy, shall be accepted to the exclusion of the votes of the other joint holders; and for this purpose seniority shall be determined by the order in which the names stand in the register of member.
63. A member of unsound mind, or in respect of whom an order has been made by any court having jurisdiction in lunacy, may vote, whether on a show of hands or on a poll, by his committee, a curator bonis, or other person in the nature of a committee or curator bonis appointed by that court, and any such committee, curator bonis, or other person may, on a poll, vote by proxy.

64. No member shall be entitled to vote at any general meeting unless all calls or other sums presently payable by him in respect of shares in the Company have been paid.
65. No objection shall be raised to the qualification of any voter except at the meeting or adjourned meeting at which the vote objected to is given or tendered, and every vote not disallowed at such meeting shall be valid for all purposes. Any such objection made in due time shall be referred to the chairman of the meeting whose decision shall be final and conclusive.
66. On a poll votes may be given either personally or by proxy.
67. The instrument appointing a proxy shall be in writing under the hand of the appointer or his attorney duly authorized in writing, or if the appointer is a corporation, either under the common seal, or under the hand of an officer or attorney so authorized. A member shall not be entitled to appoint more than one proxy to attend on the same occasion nor may a proxy vote except on a poll.
68. The instrument appointing a proxy and the power of attorney or other authority, if any, under which it is signed or a naturally certified copy of that power or authority shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than forty-eight hours before the time for holding the meeting, or adjourned meeting, or taking of the poll at which the person named in the instrument proposes to vote, and in default the instrument of proxy shall not be treated as valid.
69. An instrument appointing a proxy may be in the following form, or in any other form which the directors shall approve:-

70. Any corporation which is a member of the Company may by resolution of its directors or other governing body authorize such person as it thinks fit to act as its representative at any meeting of the Company and the person so authorized shall be entitled to exercise the same powers on behalf of the corporation which he represents as that corporation could exercise if it were an individual member of the Company.

DIRECTORS

71. The first directors shall be not less than two in number and shall be appointed by the subscribers to the Memorandum of Association. Unless and until otherwise determined by the Company by ordinary resolution the number of directors shall not be less than two.
72. The names of the first directors of the Company are as follows:

73. (1) The remuneration of the directors shall from time to time be determined by the Company in general meeting.
- (2) In addition to their usual remuneration the directors shall also be paid such traveling, hotel and other expenses as may reasonably be incurred by them in the exercise of their duties, including any such expenses incurred in connection with their attendance at meetings of director.
74. Any director any in writing appoint any person, who is approved by the majority of the directors, to be his alternate to act in his place at any meeting of the directors to which he is unable to be present. Every such alternate shall be entitled to notice of meetings of the directors and to attend and vote there at as a director when the person appointing him is not personally present, and where he is a director, to have a separate vote on behalf of the director he is representing in addition to his own vote. A director may at any time in writing revoke the appointment of an alternate appointed by him. Every such alternate shall be an officer of the Company and shall not be deemed to be the agent of the director appointing him. The remuneration of such alternate shall be payable out of the remuneration payable to the director appointing him, and the proportion thereof shall be agreed between them. An alternate director need not hold nay share qualification.
75. A director and alternate director shall not require a share qualification by nevertheless shall be entitled to attend and speak at any general meeting of the Company and at any separate meeting of the holders of any class of shares in the Company.
76. The Company may by extraordinary resolution remove any director before the expiration of his period of office, and may by an ordinary resolution appoint another person in his stead. An vacancy occurring in the board of directors may be filled up by the Company by an ordinary resolution.

POWERS AND DUTIES OF DIRECTORS

77. The business of the Company shall be managed by the directors, who may pay all expenses incurred in forming and registering the Company, and may exercise all such powers of the Company as are not, by the Companies Act 2002 or any statutory modification thereof, for the time being in force, or by these articles, required to be exercised by the Company in general meeting, subject nevertheless to the provisions of these articles and of the said Act, and the exercise of such powers shall be subject to control of any general meeting of the Company specially convened for the purpose, but no resolution of the Company in general meeting shall invalidate any prior act of the directors which would have been valid if that resolution had not been passed.
78. The directors may from time to time appoint one or more of their body to the office of managing director or manager for such term and at such remuneration (whether by way of salary, or commission, or participation in profits, or partly in one way and partially in another) as they may think fit. The office of managing director shall be subject to determination ipso facto if he ceases from any cause to be a director, or if the Company in general meeting resolves that his tenure of the office of managing director or manager be determined.
79. The directors may exercise all the powers of the Company to borrow money, and to mortgage or charge its undertaking, property, uncalled capital, or any part thereof, and to issue debentures, debenture stock and other securities whether outright or as security for any debt liability or

- 8.1 The directors shall cause minutes to be made in the books provided for the purpose:-
- (a) Of all appointments of officers made by the directors;
 - (b) Of the names of the directors present at each meeting of the directors and of any committee of the directors;
 - (c) Of all resolutions and proceedings at all meetings of the Company, and of the directors, and of committees of directors and every director present at any meeting of directors or committee of directors shall sign his name in a book to be kept for that purpose.

DISQUALIFICATION OF DIRECTORS

82. The Office of any director shall be vacated, if the director:
- (a) Resigns his office by notice in writing to the Company; or
 - (b) Becomes bankrupt in this Territory or in any other territory which is declared to be a reciprocating territory under section 147 of the bankruptcy Ordinance; or
 - (c) Is found lunatic or becomes unsound mind; or
 - (d) Is punished with imprisonment for a term exceeding six months without the option of fine; or
 - (e) Is requested in writing by all his co-directors to resign.
83. Any director or any Company of firm of which a director is a member, may enter into contracts with the Company and any director may vote as a director or shareholder in respect of such contract and retain for his own use profits made by him under any such contract; provided always that unless he be at the time sole director he must disclose his interest to his co-directors before the contract is entered into by the directors, and if he be at the time sole directors be interested contract the contract must be entered into by the Company in general meeting, and before the contract is entered into, the director or directors must disclose his or their interest to the meeting.

PROCEEDINGS OF DIRECTORS

84. The directors may meet together for the dispatch of, adjourn and otherwise regulate their meetings, as they think fit, question arising at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes. In case of any equality of votes the chairman shall have a second or casting vote. A director may, and the secretary on the requisition of a director shall, at any time summon a meeting of the directors.
85. The quorum necessary for the transaction of the business of the directors may be fixed by the directors, and unless so fixed shall be two.
86. The continuing directors may act notwithstanding any vacancy in the body, but, if and so long as their number is reduced below the number fixed by or pursuant to these articles as the quorum of directors, the continuing director may act for the purpose of increasing the number of directors to that number, or summoning a general meeting of the Company, but for no other purpose.
87. The Directors may elect a chairman of their general meeting and determine the period for which he is to hold office; but if no such chairman is elected, or if at any meeting the chairman is not present within five minutes after the time appointed for holding the same, the directors present may choose one of their number to be chairman of their meeting.
88. The directors may delegate any of their powers to committees consisting of such members of their body as they think fit; any committee so formed shall in the exercise of the powers so delegate conform to any regulation that may be imposed on them by the directors.

89. A committee may elect a chairman of their meeting; if no such chairman is elected, or if at any meeting the chairman is not present within five minutes after the time appointed for holding the same, the members present may choose any of their number to be chairman of the meeting.
90. A committee may meet and adjourn as they think proper. Questions arising at any meeting shall be determined by a majority of votes of the members present, and in the case of an equality of votes the chairman shall have a second or casting vote.
91. All acts done by any meeting of the directors or of a committee of directors, or any person acting as a director, shall, notwithstanding that it afterwards discovered that there was some defect in the appointment of any such directors or persons acting as aforesaid, or that they or any of them were disqualified, be as valid as if every such person had been duly appointed to be a director.
92. A resolution determined on without any meeting of directors and evidenced by writing under the hands of all directors, or sole director, or of all members of a committee, or of sole member of a committee, shall be as valid and effectual as a resolution duly passed at meeting of the directors or of such committee.

SECRETARY

93. The secretary shall be appointed by the directors for such term, at such remuneration and upon such conditions as they may think fit and any Secretary so appointed may be removed by them.
94. No person shall be appointed or hold office as a Secretary who is:-
- (a) the sole director of the Company; or
 - (b) a corporation the sole director of which is the sole director of the Company; or
 - (c) the sole director of a corporation which is the sole director of the Company
95. A provision of the Companies Act 2002 or these regulations requiring or authorizing a thing to be done by or to a director and the secretary shall not be satisfied by its being done by or to the same person acting both as director and as, or in place of the secretary.

THE SEAL

96. The Director shall provide for the safe custody of the seal, which shall only be used by the authority of the directors or of a committee of the directors or of a committee of the directors authorized by the directors in that behalf, and every instrument to which the Seal Secretary or by a second director or by some other person appointed by the directors for the purpose but so that the directors may by resolution determine, either generally or in any particular case, that the signature of any director may be affixed by some mechanical means to be specified in such resolution, provided that the use of such means is by such resolution restricted to certificates which have first been approved for sealing by the Auditors, Transfer Auditors, Transfer Agents or Bankers of the Company in writing.

DIVIDENDS AND RESERVE

97. The Company in general meeting may declare dividends, but no dividend shall exceed the amount recommended by the directors.
98. The directors may from time to time pay to the members such interim dividends as appear to the directors to be justified by the profits of the Company.
99. No dividends shall be paid otherwise than out of profits.

100. Subject to the rights of persons, if any, entitled to shares with special rights as to dividends, all dividends shall be declared and paid according to the amounts paid on the shares, but if and so long as nothing is paid up on any of shares in the Company dividends may be declared and paid according to the amount of the shares. No amount paid on a share in advance of call shall, while carrying interest, be treated for purpose of this article as paid on the share.

101. The directors may, before recommending and dividend, set aside out of the profits of the Company such sums as they think proper as a reserve or reserves which shall, at the discretion of the directors, be applicable for meeting contingencies, or for equalizing dividends, or for any other purpose to which the profits of the Company may be properly applied, and pending such application may, at the like discretion, either be employed in the business of the Company or be invested in such investments (other than shares of the Company) as the directors may from time to time think fit.

102. If several persons are registered as joint holders of any share any one of them may give effectual receipts for any dividends payable on the share.

103. No dividend shall bear interest against the Company.

ACCOUNTS

104. The directors shall cause proper books of accounts to be kept with respect to:-

All sums of money received and expended by the Company, and the matters in respect of which the receipt and expenditure takes place.

All sales and purchases of goods by the Company; and The Assets and liabilities of the Company. Proper books of account means such books as are necessary to give a true and fair view of the state of the Company's affairs and to explain its transactions.

105. The books of accounts shall be kept at the registered office of the Company, or at such other place or places as the directors think fit, and shall always be open to the inspection of the directors.

106. The directors shall from time to time determine whether and to what extend and at what time and places and under what conditions or regulations the accounts and books of the Company or any of them shall be open to the inspection of members not being directors, and no member (not being a director) shall have any right of inspecting any account or book or document of the Company except as conferred by statute or authorized by the directors or by the Company in general meeting.

107. The directors shall from time to time in accordance with section 123 of the Companies Act 2002 or any statutory modification thereof for the time being in force, cause to be prepared and to be laid before the Company in general meeting such profit an loss accounts, balance sheet, group accounts (if any) and reports as are referred to in those sections.

108. A copy of every balance sheet (including every document required by the law to be annexed thereto) which is to be laid before the Company in General meeting before the date of the meeting together either a copy of the auditors report, shall not less than twenty one days be sent to every member of, and every holder of debentures of, the Company and to every person registered under regulation 19. Provided that the regulation shall not require a copy of those documents to be sent to any member of whose address the Company is not aware or to more than one of the joint holders of any shares or debentures.

CAPITALISATION OF PROFITS

109. The Company is general meeting may upon the recommendation of the directors resolve that the desirable to capitalize any part of the amount for the time being standing to the credit of any of the

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A notice may be given by the Company to the persons entitled to a share in consequence of the death or bankruptcy of a member by sending it through the post in a prepaid letter addressed to them by name, or by the title of representatives of the deceased, or trustees of the bankrupt, or by any like description, at the address, if any, in the United Republic of Tanzania supplied for the purpose by the persons claiming to be so entitled, or (until such an address has been so supplied) by giving the notice in any manner in which the same might have been given if the death or bankruptcy had not occurred.

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Notice of any general meeting shall be given in the same manner hereinbefore authorized to (a) every member of the Company except those members who (having no registered address within the United Republic of Tanzania) have not supplied to the Company an address within The United Republic of Tanzania for the giving of notices to them, (b) every person entitled to share in consequence of death or bankruptcy of a member, who, but for his death or bankruptcy, would be entitled to receive notice of the meeting and (c) the auditors for the time being of the company. No other person shall be entitled to receive notices of general meetings.

WINDING UP

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If the Company shall be wound up the liquidator may, with the sanction of an extraordinary resolution of the Company and any other sanction required by the Companies Act 2002 divide amongst the members in specie or kind the whole or any part of the assets of the Company (whether they shall consist of property of the same kind or not) and may, for such purpose set such value as he deems fair upon any property to be divided as aforesaid and may determine how such decision shall be carried out as between the members or different classes of members. The Liquidator may, with sanction, vest the whole or any part of the assets in trustees upon such trusts for the benefit of the contributors as the liquidator, with the like sanction shall think fit, but so that no member shall be compelled to accept any shares or other securities whereon there is any liability.

INDEMNITY

120.

Subject to the provisions of the Companies Act 2002 every director, managing director, agent, auditor, secretary and other officer for the time being of the Company shall be indemnified in any proceedings, whether civil or criminal, in which judgment is given in his favor or in which he is acquitted.
