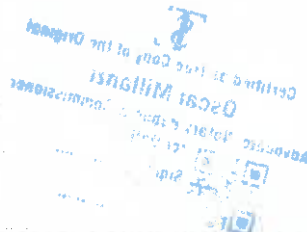

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generally to deal in all types of motor spare parts and industrial and agricultural machinery and parts, electronic goods and accessories thereof.

- (g) To provide the business of travel agents, car hire, tour operators, tourist agents and contractors, insurance, forwarding and general agents, aircraft and ship owners, charters, hotels, apartment and lodging house keepers, caterers, advertising agents and generally to facilitate traveling and provide for tourists and travelers or promote and provisions of facilities of every description and in particular by means of booking of travel ticket and hotel and lodging accommodation, providing guides, safe deposits, inquiry bureaux and baggage transport and arranging and operating tours.
- (h) To carry on or otherwise to engage in the business of mining, as miners, buyers, processors, exporters of minerals, dealers in gemstones, precious stones and or jewels, to own and run jewellery shops, to engage in cutting and polishing gems, diamonds and any other type of gems or precious stones and to do any kind of business connected with minerals.
- (i) To carry on the business of miners and mining in all their branches and for the said purpose to peg, purchase, take on lease, or exchange or otherwise acquire concessions, grants, easements, options, claims, properties, cassettes and effects supposed to contain minerals, diamonds, or other precious stones, and any interest therein, and to explore, mine, work, excise develop and turn to account mines and mining rights and any undertaking connected therewith.
- (j) To carry on the business of buying and selling of all types of minerals and gemstones including diamonds found in the United Republic of Tanzania and to engage in exportation of rough, cut and polished minerals and gemstones including diamonds to different parts of the world and to open up ligidaries and to acquire mine workings and mining grounds in Tanzania.
- (k) To carry on the main business of providing courier services, for delivering mail and parcels to and from the Government, individual persons, offices, shops factories, schools, hospitals, non Government offices by road, Water, rail or by Air or by any means, any kind and other related services and or ancillary thereto
- (l) To carry on the business as general traders, suppliers, merchants, stockists, wholesalers, retailers and dealers in all types of electrical goods, hardware, building materials, spare parts and maintenance, tyres, tubes, tools and accessories for all types of automotive, motor vehicles, agricultural machinery, implements, equipment, all kinds of industrial projects machinery and equipment, timber, fishing gears, computers, office equipments, cooking oils, foodstuffs, cosmetics, oils, paints, spirits sheets, hinges, screws, iron mongery, textiles piece goods, all types of leather goods, shoes, bags and other similar goods.
- (m) To carry on the business of establishing and running mini supermarkets, shopping malls, department stores, provision stores and shops of all kinds and description and generally to deal with such activities.
- (n) To carry on the business of importers, exporters, manufacturers, wholesalers, retailers, general traders, suppliers, merchants, stockists and dealers in all types of clothes, belt, leather products, shoes, bags, suit cases, textile materials, tie and dye, boutique, flowers, selling second hand clothing, dresses of types and description whatsoever.
- (o) To carry on the business of household, domestic appliance and electrical goods, audio visual goods, electronic items, building material, hardwares, foodstuff, agricultural products and merchandise of every nature, kind and description whatsoever as a dealer, wholesaler, retailer, distributor, importer, exporter and after sales service and repairing.
- (p) To engage in and carry out the business of proprietors and managers of hotels, restaurants, cafes, road houses, motels, safari and holiday camps, caravan sites, guest houses, apartment housekeepers, refreshment and tea rooms, milk and snacks bars, tavern, beer house and lodging

engage in activities that uses Information technology, Information systems, system analysis and design, programming, hardware repairing and manufacturing.

- (aa) To carry on the business as traders, importers, exporters wholesalers, retailers, factory, manufacturer, agents and representatives, commission agents, del-credere agents, auctioneers, brokers and to buy, sell, hire, barter, pledge, exchange, trade and deal in varieties of goods, articles and merchandise.
- (bb) To carry out the business of debt collection, repossessing and auctioning.
- (cc) To carry on the business of mining industries including oil and gas, mining and mining refining of all types of minerals and gemstones including diamonds in all parts of the United Republic of Tanzania.
- (dd) To carry out banking business, business consultancy and all financial activities as a banker, consultant, financier, client, agent, broker and any other role.
- (ee) To carryout broadcasting businesses and activities using radio and Television. To establish and run newspaper, newsletters, magazines, journals and all publications the firm may deem fit.
- (ff) To cultivate, grow, buy and prepare all kind of fruits products either in its raw form or its processed form and other agricultural products. The firm can engage in importation, exportation and distribution of agricultural machineries, fertilizer, seeds, and other products.
- (gg) To carry on the business or trade and deal in the export of all wild live birds, animals, and generally any kind of pets for sale and export, improve, import, deal and trade in carvings, paintings, curios game skins, pottery, leather and coconut by-products, beeswax, meat, ghee, cooking oils, charcoal, corn flour, cloves, cheese and commodities from by-products of milk.
- (hh) To carry on and deal in the business of pharmaceuticals, medical preparations, chemicals, animal feeds, manufacturing, making and assembling of machines equipment, plants, vessels, devices of all descriptions using modern technology appropriate and applicable to veterinary and agricultural industries.
- (ii) To engage in, conduct in and between any and all the regions and districts in Tanzania, neighbouring countries and other foreign countries, as agents or otherwise, the business of general trucking, forwarding, cartage, storage, warehousing, consolidation, distributing, wharf age, contracting loading, unloading and stevedore business and to conduct as general brokerage service business and to handle and forward for transportation by air, highway, water and rail, road between cities, towns, villages and other places in various parts of the world, personal bills, notes, packages, merchandise, luggage, goods, wares, parcels and other movable and personal property over and on such lines and routes as may from time to time exist and generally to act as agents for land and estate, brokers, charters, auctioneers, clearing and forwarding agents, insurance agents and agency in all its respective branches.
- (jj) To carry on the business and act as managers of investments and investment company, commission agents, real estate property managers, developers, valuers, decorators, engineers and to generally be able to carry out activities of any description with regards to land, property and real estate, investment in any type of property, buildings, lands, securities, bonds, shares and any property act as a holding company with subsidiaries and invest in any projects as the company may think fit.
- (kk) To carry on the business of real estate affairs; apartment house management; apartments renting of real estate leasing of; real estate agencies; real estate appraisal; real estate brokers; real estate management; rent collection; rental of offices real estate renting of apartments; renting of flats.

- (r) To carry on the business and act as managers of investments and investment company, insurance agents, brokers, commissions agents, real estate agents, property managers, developers, valuers, decorators, engineers and to generally be able to carry out activities of any description with regards to land, property and real estate, investment in any type of buildings, lands, securities, bonds, property, shares and any property act as a holding company with subsidiaries and invest in any projects as the company may think fit.
- (s) To carry on the business as insurance agents, auctioneer, real estate management, commission agents, brokers, importers, exporters, manufacturers, land and estate agents, technical advisors, clearing and forwarding agents, managing agents, general business consultants, garage and lake vessels, boat builders, petrol and service stations owners, motels camps safari lodges, cafes snacks refreshment rooms, licensed victuallers, owners of recreation places and sports and amusements, all businesses and trades incidental or similar thereto or required to be or capable of being carried on in conjunction therewith.
- (t) To carry on the business as general suppliers of all sorts and types of goods and services to individuals, offices, industries, shops, schools, factories, hospitals, army, military, ministries and all other government offices, universities and all other places where the services of a supplier are needed.
- (u) To engage in events management, public relations, marketing activities and or all business activities that use electronic media, printing media, and public involvement events.
- (v) To carry out all activities concerning entertainment, conference centres, events management.
- (w) To purchase, own or otherwise acquire lands, real property, easements, rights and other property, real or personal for the purpose and conducive to the objects of the Company including farming, cultivation of cassava, maize, potato, cereal crops and other agricultural crops which are suitable for the manufacture and production of starch and other derivatives aforementioned.
- (x) To engage in business of general sanitation services, such as fumigation and office cleaning.
- (y) To carry out all or any of the business of office stationeries, printing, internet services, computer networks, lithographers, stereotypes, electrotypes, engravers, photographic printers, photo lithographers, engravers, typesetting machine operators, die sinkers, envelope makers, book binders, account book manufacturers, machine, rules, numerical printers, paper makers, paper baffles and account book makers, box makers, flax and box file makers, cardboard manufacturers, type foundry, photographers, manufacturers of and dealers in playing, visiting, railways, festival, invitation, business complimentary and fancy cards and valentine, dealers in parchment, stamp, agents, designers, draftsmen, manufacturers, book sellers, publishers and dealers in materials used in the manufacturer of manufacturers or any other articles or things or character similar or analogous to the foregoing or any of them or connected therewith and to deal in the manufacture of and sell and by wholesale or retail of school chalks, and secretarial services.
- (z) To carry out the business of buying, selling and servicing of computers and their parts, television sets, radios, mobile telephones, telecommunication equipments and other electronic machines. To

- (ll) To carry on the business of joint-ventures, private public partnerships, financing, small and medium entrepreneurial business, agricultural and estate ventures, capital – ventures, strategic-investors, mergers, fund managers, bankers, trade facilitators, planners, consultants, tourism industry developers, realtors, hotel and hospitality, conferences, exhibitions trade and commerce-missionaries, manufacture representatives, commission agents and legal consulting agents.
- (mm) To carry on the business of marketing, services, consultancy and selling of all types of telecommunication systems, information technologies, computer systems, conference systems, security systems, public address systems, data communication and to train, research, install and after sale services of electronic systems, voice and data networks and any other systems or components which the company may think fit, necessary or incidental to this business.
- (nn) To carry on the business of spare parts for different types of machines and instruments including motor vehicles, cars, trucks, lorries or other vehicles, agricultural implements, mining implements and any other machinery, tool maker, metal workers, boil makers and any other kind of machine whatsoever.
- (oo) To purchase, take or lease or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire and hold any state or interest in any lands, buildings, residential, commercial, low cost housing estates, shopping malls, residential houses, serviced apartments and villas, housing compounds, warehouse, office, shop, casements, rights, licenses secret processes, machinery, plants, stock, in trade and real or personal property of any kind.
- (pp) To carry on the business of manufacturing soft drink, water, fruit drinks and fruit juices, and to pack and sell the same by whole sale or retail locally and to export the same to different parts of the world.
- (qq) To establish and support or aid in the establishment and support of associations, institutions, funds, trusts, and clubs calculated to benefit the employees or ex-employees of the company which is a subsidiary company of the company or is allied thereto or associated therewith, or dependents or connections of such persons, and to grant or provide pensions and allowances, to make or enter into arrangements for the provisions of policies of life assurance, pensions or other benefits to or for any Directors or employees of the company, or any such predecessors of such company as foresaid, or the relations, connections or dependents of any such persons, to pay or contribute towards the payment of premiums in respect of any such policies, pensions or benefits, to establish or support funds, trusts and schemes (including funds, trusts, and schemes providing for payment towards insurance) which may be considered calculated to promote such persons or benefits.
- (rr) To sell or otherwise dispose of the whole or any part of the business or property of the company either together or in portions, for such consideration as the company thinks fit and in particular for shares, debentures, or securities of any company purchasing the same.
- (ss) To enter into (partnership or into) any arrangements for sharing profits, union or interests, Co-operation, joint venture, reciprocal, concession, or otherwise with any persons, firm or Company carrying on or engage in or transaction which this Company is authorized to carry on, or engage in any business or transaction capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit this Company. And to lend money to, guarantee the contracts of, or otherwise assist, and sell, hold, hold, re-issue with or without guarantee, or otherwise deal with the same.
- (tt) To promote any other Company for the purpose of all or any or the property, and undertaking, or any business or operation which may appear likely to assist or benefit this Company, or to enhance the value of the property or business of this Company, and to place or guarantee the placing of, underwrite, subscribe for or otherwise acquire all or any part of the shares or securities of each Company as aforesaid.

- (uu) To lend and advance money or give credit to such persons, firms or companies and on such terms as may seem expedient, and in particular to customers and others having dealings with the Company, and to give guarantee to become surety for any persons, firms or companies for the due payment of money for the performance of any obligations or liabilities.
- (vv) To receive money or deposit or loan and borrow or raise money in such manner as the Company shall think fit, and in particular by the issue of debentures, or debenture stock (perpetual or otherwise) and to secure the repayment of money borrowed, raised or owing by mortgage, charge or lien upon all or any of the property or assets of the company (both present and future) including its uncalled capital and also by a similar mortgage, charge or lien to secure and guarantee the performance by the company or any other person or company the case may be.
- (ww) To purchase or otherwise acquire letters, patents, brevets d'invention, concessions, licenses, rights and privileges subject to royalty or otherwise, and whether exclusive or in-exclusive or limited, or any part interest in such letters, patents, brevets, brevets d'invention, concessions, licenses, right and privileges, whether in East Africa or in any other part of the world.
- (xx) To take all necessary and proper steps with the authorities, national, local, municipal, or otherwise, of any place in which the company may have interests, and carry on any negotiations or operations for the purpose of directly or indirectly carrying out the objects of the company or effecting any modification in the constitution of the company or furthering the interests of its members, and to oppose any steps taken by any other company or persons which may be considered likely, directly or indirectly, to prejudice the interest of the company or its members.
- (yy) To draw, make, accept, endorse, discount, negotiate, execute and issue, buy, sell and deal in bills of exchange, promissory notes and other negotiable or transferable instruments, amalgamate or enter into partnership or any joint venture or profit-sharing arrangement with, and to co-operation in any way with or assist or subsidize any Company, firm or person.
- (zz) To promote or concur in the promotion of any Company, the promotion of which shall be considered desirable, to lend money to and guarantee the performance of the contracts, obligations of and the payment and repayment of the capital and principal of, and dividend interest or premiums payable on any stock, shares and securities of any Company, firm, or person, whether having objects similar to those of this Company or not, and to give all kinds of indemnities.
- (aaa) To sell, lease, grant licenses, easements and other rights over and in any other manner, deal with or dispose of the undertaking, property, assets, rights and effects of the Company or any part thereof for such consideration as may be thought fit and, in particular, for stock, shares or securities of any other company, whether fully or partly paid up.
- (bbb) To acquire any such shares, stocks, debentures, debenture stock, bonds, obligations or securities by original subscription, tender, purchase, exchange or otherwise, and to subscribe for the same, either conditionally or other and to guarantee the subscription thereof, and to exercise and enforce all rights and powers conferred by, or incidental to, the ownership thereof.
- (ccc) To issue debentures, debenture stock, bonds, obligations and securities of all kinds and to frame, constitute and secure the same, as may seem expedient, with full power to make the same transferable by delivery or by instrument or transfer or otherwise, and to charge or secure the same by trust deed or otherwise on the undertaking of the company or upon any specific property and rights, present and future, of the company (including, if thought fit, uncalled capital) or otherwise howsoever.
- (ddd) To take part in formation, management, supervision or control of the business or operations of any company, and for that purpose to act as Directors, Administrators, Managers, Secretaries or any other capacity and to appoint and remunerate any directors, administrators, managers, accountants or other expense or agents.

- (eee) To procure the registration of the company in or under the laws of any place outside Tanzania.
- (fff) To purchase, sell subscribed for, underwrite, or otherwise acquire and hold shares, stocks or other interest in, or obligations of any other company or corporation.
- (ggg) To distribute among the members of the company, in kind any property of the company, and in particular shares or securities of other companies belonging to this company.
- (hhh) To act as agents, or brokers and as trustees for any person or company and to undertake and perform sub-contracts and to do all or any of the above business in any part of the world, and either as principals, agents, trustees, contractors or otherwise, and either alone or jointly with others and either by or through agents, sub-contractors, trustees or otherwise.
- (iii) To act as agents for the management, improvement, development, purchase and sale of property and as agents for the purchase and sale of all manufactured goods, materials, provisions, and agricultural and other produce and for the investment, loan payment, transmission and collection of money and generally to transact and execute all kinds of agency business.
- (jjj) To carry of commercial consultants, planners and advisers to any company, corporation, undertaking, firm or individual in the conduct of commercial, industrial, financial and any other business undertaking, and to study and advise on conditions and make recommendations and prepare schemes designed to increase productivity.
- (kkk) To purchase, take on lease and otherwise acquire for investment or resale any estate, land, buildings, easements and other rights and interests in immovable property or any tenure in Tanzania and elsewhere and to sell let or lease exchange or otherwise dispose of or grant rights over any immovable property, belong to the company.
- (lll) To purchase, take or lease or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire and hold any state or interest in any lands buildings, easements, rights, licenses secret processes, machinery, plants, stock, in trade and real or personal property of any kind.
- (mmm) To accept payment for any property or rights sold or otherwise disposed or dealt with by the company either in cash, by installment or otherwise or in fully or partly paid up shares of the company or corporation, with or without deferred or preferred or guaranteed rights.
- (nnn) To carry any other trade or business whatever which can in the opinion of the Board of Directors be advantageously carried on by the Company in connection with the above business or the general business of the company.
- (ooo) To act as agents for the sale and purchase of any stocks shares or securities or for any other monetary or mercantile transactions.
- (ppp) To act as executors and trustees of wills and settlements made by customers and others and undertake and execute trusts of all kinds.
- (qqq) To do all or any of the above things in any part of the world and either as principals, agents, trustees, contractors or otherwise, and either alone or in conjunction with others and either or through agents, sub-contractors, trustees and otherwise.
- (rrr) To remunerate any person, firm or company rendering services to this company, whether by cash payments or by allotment to him or them of shares or securities of the Company credited and paid in full or in part, otherwise.

- (sss) To accept for safe custody and keep for customers of the company all kinds of securities valuables and things.
- (ttt) To lend money on any terms that may thought fit, and particularly to customers or other person or corporations having dealing with societies and to give any guarantees that may be expedient.
- (uuu) To advance money to shareholders in the company, and other to the purpose of enabling the person borrowing the same erect or purchase, or enlarge or repair any house or building or to purchase the fee simple or any less estate or interest in, or to take a demise for any term or terms of years of any freehold or leasehold property upon such terms and conditions as the company may think fit.
- (vvv) To invest and deal with the moneys of the Company not immediately required, upon such securities and in such manner as may from time to time be determined.
- (www) To distribute among the members in pieces any property of the company, or any proceeds of sale or disposal of any property of the company.
- (xxx) To draw, make, accept, endorse, discount execute and issue promissory notes, bills of lading, warrants, debentures and negotiable or transferable instruments.
- (yyy) To act as agents or brokers, and as trustees for any person firm or company, and to undertake and perform sub-contracts and also to act in any other business of the company through or by means of agents, brokers, sub-contractors or others.
- (zzz) To take or otherwise and hold shares in any other company having objects altogether or in part similar to this company, or carrying on any business capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit the company.
- (aaaa) To transact or carry on all kinds of Agency business and in particular in relation to the investment of money, the sale of property, and the collection and receipt of money.

And it is hereby declared that:-

The word "company" in this clause, except where used in reference to this Company, shall be deemed to include any partnership or other body of persons, whether corporate or incorporate, and whether domiciled in the United Republic of Tanzania or elsewhere.

The object specified in each of the paragraphs of the paragraph of this clause shall be regarded as independent objects, and accordingly shall in no way be limited or restricted (except where otherwise expressed in such paragraphs) by reference to or inference from the terms of any other paragraph of the name of the Company but may be carried out in as full and ample a manner and construed in as wide a sense as if each of the said paragraph define the objects of the separate and distinct compound.




That the meaning of any general word or words in any paragraph of this clause shall not be restricted by being construed ejusdem generis with any particular word or words in the same paragraph.

preferential, deferred or special rights, privileges, or conditions as may be determined by or in accordance with the Articles of Association of the Company.

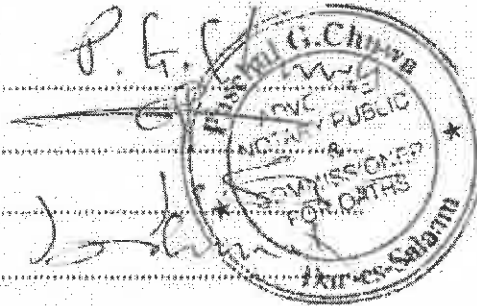

TABLE A EXCLUDE

1. The regulations in Table A in the First Schedule to the Company Act 2002 shall not apply to the Company, except so far as the same are repeated or contained in these Articles.

INTERPRETATION

In these Articles, unless the subject or context otherwise requires, the words standing in the first column of the table next hereinafter contained shall bear the meanings set opposite to them respectively in the second column thereof.

WORDS AND MEANINGS

"Articles": these Articles of Association as originally framed or as altered from time to time by Special Resolution;

"A Shareholder": any holder from time to time of the Shares;

"The Directors": the directors for the time being of the Company present at a duly convened meeting of the directors at which a quorum is present;

"The Office": the registered office for the time being of the Company;

"The Act": the Companies Act 2002 and every statutory modification and re-enactment thereof for the time being in force;

2. The Company is a Private Company and accordingly; no invitation or offer shall be made to the public (whether for cash or otherwise) to subscribe for any shares in or debentures of the Company, nor shall the Company allot or agree to allot (whether for cash or otherwise) any shares in or debentures of the Company with a view to all or any of those shares or debentures being offered for sale to the public.

The Company may pay to any person a commission in consideration of his subscribing or agreeing to subscribe, whether absolute or conditional, for any shares in the Company: provided that such commission shall not exceed 10 per cent of the price at which such shares are issued, or an amount equivalent to such percentage; and the requirements of Section 56 of the Act shall be observed.

3. a. The Directors may subject to Article 48 hereof allot, grant options over, or otherwise deal with or dispose of any relevant securities of the Company in accordance with the provisions of these Articles and the Act to such persons and generally on such terms and conditions as the Directors think proper.

- b. The general authority conferred by paragraph (a) of this article shall be conditional upon due compliance with Article 48 hereof and shall extend to the amount of the authorized share capital of the Company upon its incorporation.
 - c. The Directors shall be entitled under the general authority conferred by paragraph (a) of this Article to make at any time before the expiry of such authority any offer or agreement which will or might require relevant securities of the Company to be allotted after the expiry of such authority.
4. If two or more persons are registered as joint holders of any share, any one of such persons may give effectual receipts for any dividends or other moneys payable in respect of such share.
 5. No person shall be recognized by the Company as holding any share upon any trust, and the Company shall not be bound by or required to recognize and equitable, contingent, future or partial interest in any share or any right whatsoever in respect of any share other than an absolute right to the entirety thereof in the registered holder, except as by these Articles otherwise expressly provide or as required by law.

CAPITAL

6. The capital of the Company is Shillings 1,000,000,000/= divided into 10,000 shares of Shillings 100,000/= each.

SHARES

7. Without prejudice to any special rights previously conferred on the holders of any existing shares or class of shares, any share in the capital of the Company may be issued with such preferred, deferred or other special rights or such restrictions, whether in regard to dividend, voting, return of capital or otherwise as the Company may from time to time by ordinary resolution determine.
8. Subject to the provisions of Companies Act 2002, any preference shares may, with the sanction of an ordinary resolution, be issued on the terms that they are, or at the option of the Company are liable to be redeemed on such terms and in such manner as the Company before the issue of the shares may by Special Resolution determine.
9. The rights conferred upon the holders of the shares of any class issued with preferred or other rights shall unless otherwise expressly provided by the terms of issue of the shares of that class, be deemed not to be varied by the creation or issued of further shares ranking *pari-passu* therewith.
10. If at any time the share capital is divided into different classes of shares, the rights attached to any class (unless otherwise provided by the terms of issue of the shares of that class) may be varied with the consent in writing of the holders of the three fourths of the issued shares of that class, or with the sanction of an extraordinary resolution passed at a separate general meeting of the holders of the shares of that class. To every such separate meeting the provisions of this articles relating to general meetings shall mutatis mutandis apply, but so that the necessary quorum shall be two persons at least holding or representing by proxy one-third of the issued shares of the class and that any holder of shares of the class present in person or by proxy may demand a poll.
11. Every person whose name is entered as member in the register of members shall, without payment, be entitled to one certificate under the common seal of the Company specifying the share or shares held by him and the amount paid up thereon, provided that in respect of a share or shares held jointly by several persons the Company shall be bound to issue more than one

certificate and delivery of certificate of a share to one of several jointly holders shall be sufficient delivery to all.

12. If a share certificate is defaced, lost, or destroyed, it may be renewed on payment of such fee, if any, not exceeding one hundred shillings, and on such terms, if any, as to evidence and indemnity as the directors think fit.

LIEN

13. The Company shall have a lien on every share for all moneys (whether present payable or not) called or payable at a fixed time in respect of that share, and the Company shall also have a lien on all shares standing registered in the name of a single person for all moneys presently payable by him or his estate to the Company; but the directors may at any time declare any share to be wholly or in part exempt from the provisions of this article. The Company's lien, if any on a share shall extend to all dividends payable thereon.
14. The Company may sell, in such manner as the directors thin fit, any shares on which the Company has a lien, but no sale shall be made unless some sum in respect of which the lien exists is presently payable, nor until the expiration of fourteen days after a notice in writing, stating and demanding payment of such part of the amount in respect of which the lien exists as is presently payable, has been given to the registered holder for the time being of the share, or the person entitled by reason of his death or bankruptcy to the share.
15. For giving effect to any such sale the directors may authorise some person to transfer the share sold to the purchaser thereof. The purchaser shall be registered as the holder of the shares comprised in any such transfer and he shall not be found to see to the application of the purchaser money, nor shall his title to the shares be affected by any irregularity or invalidity in the proceedings in reference to the sale.
16. The proceeds of sale shall be applied in payment of such part of the amount in respect of which the lien exists as is presently payable, and the residue shall be held (subject to a like lien for sums not presently payable as existed upon the shares prior to the sale) by the Company on behalf of the person entitled to the shares at the date of the sale.

CALLS ON SHARES

17. The directors may from time to time make calls upon the members in respect of any moneys unpaid on their shares, and each member shall (subject to receiving at least fourteen days notice specifying the time or times of payment) pay to the Company at the time or times of specified the amount called in his shares. A call shall be deemed to have been made at the time when the resolution of the directors authorising the call was passed.
18. The joint holders of a share shall be jointly and severally liable to pay all calls in respect hereof.
19. If sum called in respect of a share is not paid before or on the date appointed for payment thereof, the person from whom the sum is due shall pay interest upon the sum at bank rate prevailing from time to time from the day appointed for payment thereof to the time of actual payment, but the directors shall be at liberty waive payment of the interest wholly or in part.
20. The provisions of these articles as to the liability of joint holders and as to payment of interest shall apply in the case of non-payment of any sum which, by the terms of issue of share, becomes payable at a fixed time, whether on account of the amount of the share, or by way of premium, as if the same has become payable by virtue of a call duly made and notified.
21. The directors may make arrangements on the issue of shares for a difference between the holders in the amount of calls to be paid and in the times of payment.

22. The directors may, if they think fit, receive from any member willing to advance the same all or any part of the moneys uncalled and unpaid upon any shares held by him; and upon all or any of the moneys so advanced may (until the same would, but for such advance, become presently payable) pay interest at such rate (not exceeding, without the sanction of any Company in general meeting, the bank rate existing from time as may be agreed upon between the member paying the sum in advance and the directors).

TRANSFER AND TRANSMISSION

23. Subject to the provisions hereinafter continued shares in the Company shall be transferable by written instrument in the common form signed by both the transfer and transferee, and the transferor shall be deemed to remain the holder of the share until the name of the transferee is entered in the register of members in respect thereof.
24. The directors may in their absolute discretion and without assigning any reason therefore decline to register any transfer of shares to any person whom they do not approve not being already a member of the Company and may also decline to register any transfer of shares on which the Company has lien. The directors may also suspend the registration of transfers during the fourteen days immediately preceding the ordinary general meeting in each year. The directors may decline to recognize any instrument of transfer unless:-
- (a) A fee not exceeding shillings two hundred and fifty is paid to the Company in respect thereof; and
 - (b) The instrument of transfer is accompanied by the certificate of the shares to which it relates, and such other evidence as the directors may reasonably require to show the right of the transfer to make the transfer.

If the directors refuse to register a transfer of any shares, they shall within two months after the date on which the transfer was lodged with the Company send to the transferee notice of the refusal.

25. The personal representatives of a deceased sole holder of share shall be the only persons recognized by the Company as having any title to the share. In the case of share registers in the names of two or more holders, the survivors or survivor, or the personal representatives of the deceased survivor, shall be the only persons recognized by the Company as having any title to the share.
26. Any person becoming entitled to a share in consequence of the death or bankruptcy of a member shall, upon such evidence being produced as may from time to time be required by the directors, have the right, either to be registered as a member in respect of the share or, instead of being registered himself, to make such transfer of share as the deceased or bankrupt person could have made; but the directors shall, in either case, have the same right to decline or suspend registration as they would have had in the case of transfer of the share by the deceased or bankrupt person before the death or bankruptcy.
27. Except as hereinafter provided no share in the Company shall be transferred unless and until the rights of pre-emption hereinafter conferred shall have been exhausted.
28. Every member or other person referred to in article 26 hereof who intends to transfer shares (hereinafter called the vendor) shall give notice in writing to the board of his intention. The notice shall constitute the board his agent for the sale of the said shares in one or more lots at the discretion of the board to members of the Company at a price to be agreed upon by the vendor and the board, and in default of agreement, at a price which the auditor of the Company for the time being shall certify, by writing under his hand, to be in his opinion, the fair selling value thereof as between a willing vendor and a willing purchaser.

29. Upon the price being fixed as aforesaid the board shall forthwith give notice to all the members of the Company other than holders of employees' shares of the number and price of the shares to be sold and invite each of them to state in writing within twenty-one days from the date of the said notice whether he is willing to purchase any, and if so, what maximum number, of the said shares.
30. At the expiration of the said twenty-one days the board shall allocate the said shares to or among the member or members who shall have expressed his or their willingness to purchase as aforesaid, and (if more than one) so far as may be pro rata according to the number of shares already held by them respectively, provided that no member shall be obliged to take more than the said maximum number of shares so notified by him as aforesaid. Upon such allocation being made the vendor shall be bound on payment of the said price to transfer the shares to the purchaser or purchasers. If he make default in so doing the chairman for the time being of the directors of the Company or failing him one of the directors duly nominated by resolution of the board for that purpose shall forthwith be deemed to be duly appointed attorney of the vendor with full power to execute complete and deliver in the name and on behalf of the vendor a transfer of the shares to the purchasing member and the board may receive and give a good discharge for the purchase-money on behalf of the vendor and enter the name of the purchaser in the register of members as holder by transfer of the shares purchased by him.
31. In the event of the whole of the said shares not being purchased under article 28 the vendor may, at any time within six calendar months after the expiration of the said twenty-one days, transfer the shares not sold to any person (subject to article 17) and at any price.
32. Articles 25, 26, 27, 28 and 29 hereof shall not apply to a transfer to a person who is already a member of the Company, nor to a transfer merely for the purpose of effecting the appointment of new trustees, nor to a transfer by personal representatives to a legatee under the will of, or to the husband, wife or next of kin of a deceased member, nor to a transfer by trustee to a beneficiary, provided that it is proved to the satisfaction of the board that the transfer bona fide falls within one of these exceptions.

FORFEITURE OF SHARES AND EXPROPRIATION OF SMALL HOLDINGS

33. If a member fails to pay any call or installment of a call, on the day appointed for payment thereof, the directors may at any time thereafter during such time as any part of such call or installment remains unpaid, serve a notice on him requiring payment of so much of the call or installment as is unpaid, together with any interest which may have accrued.
34. The notice shall name a further day (not earlier than the expiration of fourteen days from the date of the notice) on or before which the payment required by the notice is to be made, and shall state that in the event of non-payment at or before the time appointed the shares in respect of which the call was made will be liable to be forfeited.
35. If the requirements of any such notice as aforesaid are not complied with, any share in respect of which the notice has been given may at any time thereafter, before the payment required by the notice has been made, be forfeited by a resolution of the directors to that effect and such forfeiture shall extend to any dividends in respect of any share so forfeited not actually paid at the date of the said notice.
36. A forfeited share may be sold or otherwise disposed of on such terms and in such manner as the directors think fit, and at any time before a sale or disposition the forfeiture may be cancelled on such terms as the directors think fit.
37. A person whose shares have been forfeited shall cease to be a member in respect of the forfeited shares, but shall notwithstanding, remain liable to pay to the Company all moneys which, at the

date of the forfeiture, were presently payable by him to the Company in respect of the shares, but his liability shall cease if and when the Company receive payment in the full of the nominal amount of the shares.

38. The holders for the time being of four-fifths of the issued shares in the Company shall be entitled at any time to purchase ex dividend all or any of the shares held by any member of the Company at a price equal to the sum paid up thereon and upon the tender of that price by the holders of four-fifths of the issued shares to any other member for the shares held by him that member shall execute transfer of the shares to the members by whom the tender is made or their nominees in such shares and proportions as they shall direct. If the member to whom the tender is made neglects or refuses to accept the sum tendered or to execute transfers of the shares the Company may on proof of his neglect or refusal accept and give a good discharge for the moneys tendered on behalf of the member to whom the same shall have been tendered, and the provisions of article 23 shall apply to the execution of transfer of the shares and the registration of the members by whom the tender was made or their nominees as owners of the said shares.
39. A statutory declaration in writing that declarant is a director of the Company, and that a share in the Company has been duly forfeited or expropriated on a date sated in the declaration, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated as against all persons claiming to be entitled to the share. The Company may receive the consideration, if any, given for the share on any sale or disposition thereof and may execute a transfer of the share in favor of the person to whom the share is sold or disposed of and he shall thereupon be registered as the holder of the share, and shall not be bound to see to the application of the purchase-money, if any, nor shall his title to the share be affected by any irregularity or invalidity in the proceedings in reference to the forfeiture or expropriation, sale or disposal of the share.
40. The provisions of these articles as to forfeiture shall apply in the case of non-payment of any sum which, by terms of issue of share, becomes payable at a fixed time, whether on account of the amount of the share, or by way of premium, as if the same had been payable by virtue of a call duly made and notified.

ALTERATION OF CAPITAL

41. The Company may, from time to time by ordinary resolution increase the share capital by such sum, to be divided into shares of such amount, as the resolution shall prescribe.
42. Subject to any direction to the contrary that may be given by the resolution sanctioning the increase of share capital, all new shares shall, before issue, be offered to such persons as at the date of the offer are entitled to receive notices from the Company of general meetings in proportion, as nearly as the circumstances admit, to the amount of the existing shares to which they are entitled. The offer shall be made by notice specifying the number of shares offered, and limiting a time within which the offer, if not accepted, will be deemed to be declined, and after the expiration to that time, or on receipt of an intimation from the person to whom the offer is made that he declines to accept the shares offered, the directors may dispose of the same in such manner as they think most beneficial to the Company. The directors may likewise so dispose of any new shares which (by reason of the ratio which the new shares bear to shares held by persons entitled to an offer of new shares cannot, in the opinion of the director, be conveniently offered under this article.
43. The new shares shall be subject to the same provisions with reference to payment of calls, lien, transfer, transmission, forfeiture, expropriation, and otherwise as the shares in the original share capital.
44. The Company may by ordinary resolution:-

- (a) Consolidate and divide all or any of its share capital into shares of larger amount than its existing shares;
- (b) Sub-divide its existing shares, or any of them, into shares of smaller amount than is fixed by the memorandum of association, subject, nevertheless, to the Companies Act.
- (c) Cancel any shares which, at the date of the passing of the resolution, have not been taken or agreed to be taken by any person;
and may by special resolution-
- (d) Reduce its share capital and any capital redemption reserve fund in any manner and with, and subject to, any incident authorized, and consent, required, by law.

GENERAL MEETINGS

- 45. The Company shall in each year hold a general meeting as its annual general meeting in addition to any other meetings in that year, and shall specify the meeting as such in the notices calling it, and not more than fifteen months shall elapse between the date of one annual general meeting and that of the next. Provided that so long as the Company holds its first annual general meeting within eighteen months of its incorporation, it need not hold it in the year of its incorporation or in the following year. The annual general meeting shall be held at such time and at such place as the directors shall appoint.
- 46. All general meeting other than the annual general meeting shall be called extraordinary general meetings.
- 47. The directors may, whenever they think fit, convene an extraordinary general meeting. If at any time there are not within the united republic of Tanzania sufficient directors capable of acting to form a quorum, any director or any one member of the Company may convene an extraordinary general meeting in the same manner as nearly as possible as that in which meetings may be convened by the directors.

PROCEEDINGS AT GENERAL MEETINGS

- 48. An annual general meeting and a meeting called for the passing of special resolution shall be called by twenty-one days' notice in writing at the least, and all other meetings by fourteen days' notice in writing at least. Such notice shall be exclusive of the day on which it is served or deemed to be served and of the day for which it is given and shall specify the place, the day, and the hour of meeting and, in case of special business, the general nature of the business shall be given in the manner hereinafter mentioned, or in such other manner, if any, as may be prescribed by Company in general meeting to such persons as are, under these articles, entitled to receive such notices from the Company; but with the consent of all the members entitled to receive notice of some particular meeting, that meeting may be convened by such shorter notice and in such manner as those members may think fit.
- 49. The accidental omission to give notice to, or the non-receipt of notice of a meeting by, any member shall not invalidate the proceedings at any meetings.
- 50. All business shall be deemed special that is transacted at an extraordinary general meeting, and all that is transacted at an annual general meeting, with the exception of sanctioning a dividend, the consideration of the accounts and balance sheet and the ordinary report of the directors and auditors, the election of directors in the place of those retiring by rotation, and the appointment and fixing of the remuneration of the directors.
- 51. No business shall be transacted at any general meeting unless a quorum of members is present at the time when the meeting proceeds to business; same as herein otherwise provided two members personally present shall be a quorum.

52. If within half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting a quorum is not present, the meeting, if convened upon the requisition of members, shall be dissolved; and in any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week, at the same time and place, and, if at the adjourned meeting a quorum is not present within half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting the meeting shall be dissolved.
53. The chairman, if any, of the board of directors shall preside as chairman at every general meeting of the Company.
54. If there is no such chairman, or if at any meeting he is not present within fifteen minutes after the time appointed for holding the meeting or is unwilling to act as chairman, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be chairman.
55. The chairman may, with the consent of any meeting at which a quorum is present (and shall if so directed by the meeting), adjourn the meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place. When a meeting is adjourned for thirty days or more, notice of the adjourned meeting shall be given as in the case of an original meeting. Save as aforesaid it shall not be necessary to give any notice of an adjournment or of the business to be transacted at an adjourned meeting.
56. At any general meeting a resolution put to the vote of the meeting shall be decided on a show of hands, unless a poll is (before or on the declaration of the result of the show of hands) demanded by at least one member entitled to vote present in person or by proxy; and unless a poll is so demanded, a declaration by the chairman that the resolution has, on a show of hands, been carried, or carried unanimously, or by particular majority, or lost, and an entry to that effect in the minute book shall be conclusive evidence of the fact, without proof of the number or proportion of the votes recorded in favor of, or against the resolution.
57. If a poll is duly demanded it shall be taken in such manner as the chairman directs, and the result of the poll shall be deemed to be a resolution of the meeting at which the poll was demanded.
58. In the case of an equality of votes, whether on a show of hands or on a poll, the chairman of the meeting at which the show of hands takes place, or at which the poll is demanded, shall be entitled to a second or casting vote.
59. A poll demanded on the election of a chairman, or in a question of adjournment, shall be taken forthwith. A poll demanded on any other question shall be taken at such time as the chairman of the meeting directs.
60. Any ordinary resolution of the Company determined on without any general meeting and evidenced by writing under the hands of all the directors or a sole director and of members of the Company holding three-fourths of the issued shares of the Company shall be as valid and effectual as an ordinary resolution duly passed at a general meeting of the Company duly convened and held.

VOTES OF MEMBERS

61. On a show of hands every member present in person shall have one vote. On a poll every member shall have one vote for each share of which he is the holder.
62. In the case of joint holders the vote of the senior who tenders a vote, whether in person or by proxy, shall be accepted to the exclusion of the votes of the other joint holders; and for this purpose seniority shall be determined by the order in which the names stand in the register of members.
63. A member of unsound mind, or in respect of whom an order has been made by any court having jurisdiction in lunacy, may vote, whether on a show of hands or on a poll, by his committee, a

curator bonus, or other person in the nature of a committee or curator boons appointed by that court, and any such committee, curator boons, or other person may, on a poll, vote by proxy.

- 64. No member shall be entitled to vote at any general meeting unless all calls or other sums presently payable by him in respect of shares in the Company have been paid.
- 65. No objection shall be raised to the qualification of any voter except at the meeting or adjourned meeting at which the vote objected to is given or tendered, and every vote not disallowed at such meeting shall be valid for all purposes. Any such objection made in due time shall be referred to the chairman of the meeting whose decision shall be final and conclusive.
- 66. On a poll votes may be given either personally or by proxy.
- 67. The instrument appointing a proxy shall be in writing under the hand of the appointer or his attorney duly authorized in writing, or if the appointer is a corporation, either under the common seal, or under the hand of an officer or attorney so authorized. A member shall not be entitled to appoint more than one proxy to attend on the same occasion nor may a proxy vote except on a poll.
- 68. The instrument appointing a proxy and the power of attorney or other authority, if any, under which it is signed or a naturally certified copy of that power or authority shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than forty-eight hours before the time for holding the meeting, or adjourned meeting, or taking of the poll at which the person named in the instrument proposes to vote, and in default the instrument of proxy shall not be treated as valid.
- 69. An instrument appointing a proxy may be in the following form, or in any other form which the directors shall approve:-

- 70. Any corporation which is a member of the Company may by resolution of its directors or other governing body authorize such person as it thinks fit to act as its representative at any meeting of the Company and the person so authorized shall be entitled to exercise the same powers on behalf of the corporation which he represents as that corporation could exercise if it were an individual member of the Company.

DIRECTORS

- 71. The first directors shall be not less than two in number and shall be appointed by the subscribers to the Memorandum of Association. Unless and until otherwise determined by the Company by ordinary resolution the number of directors shall not be less than two.
- 72. The names of the first directors of the Company are as follows:

- 1. NAGIB MOHAMED ALLY
- 2. HAFIDH MOHAMED GULAMKADER
- 3. SHAHDAD LAHDAD SHAHDAD

73. (1) The remuneration of the directors shall from time to time be determined by the Company in general meeting.
- (2) In addition to their usual remuneration the directors shall also be paid such traveling, hotel and other expenses as may reasonably be incurred by them in the exercise of their duties, including any such expenses incurred in connection with their attendance at meetings of director.

74. Any director may in writing appoint any person, who is approved by the majority of the directors, to be his alternate to act in his place at any meeting of the directors to which he is unable to be present. Every such alternate shall be entitled to notice of meetings of the directors and to attend and vote there at as a director when the person appointing him is not personally present, and where he is a director, to have a separate vote on behalf of the director he is representing in addition to his own vote. A director may at any time in writing revoke the appointment of an alternate appointed by him. Every such alternate shall be an officer of the Company and shall not be deemed to be the agent of the director appointing him. The remuneration of such alternate shall be payable out of the remuneration payable to the director appointing him, and the proportion thereof shall be agreed between them. An alternate director need not hold any share qualification.

75. A director and alternate director shall not require a share qualification but nevertheless shall be entitled to attend and speak at any general meeting of the Company and at any separate meeting of the holders of any class of shares in the Company.

76. The Company may by extraordinary resolution remove any director before the expiration of his period of office, and may by an ordinary resolution appoint another person in his stead. A vacancy occurring in the board of directors may be filled up by the Company by an ordinary resolution.

POWERS AND DUTIES OF DIRECTORS

77. The business of the Company shall be managed by the directors, who may pay all expenses incurred in forming and registering the Company, and may exercise all such powers of the Company as are not, by the Companies Act 2002 or any statutory modification thereof, for the time being in force, or by these articles, required to be exercised by the Company in general meeting, subject nevertheless to the provisions of these articles and of the said Act, and the exercise of such powers shall be subject to control of any general meeting of the Company specially convened for the purpose, but no resolution of the Company in general meeting shall invalidate any prior act of the directors which would have been valid if that resolution had not been passed.

78. The directors may from time to time appoint one or more of their body to the office of managing director or manager for such term and at such remuneration (whether by way of salary, or commission, or participation in profits, or partly in one way and partially in another) as they may think fit. The office of managing director shall be subject to determination ipso facto if he ceases from any cause to be a director, or if the Company in general meeting resolves that his tenure of the office of managing director or manager be determined.

79. The directors may exercise all the powers of the Company to borrow money, and to mortgage or charge its undertaking, property, uncalled capital, or any part thereof, and to issue debentures, debenture stock, and other securities whether outright or as security for any debt liability or obligation of the Company or of any third party.

80. The directors shall duly comply with the provisions of the Companies Act 2002 or any statutory modification thereof for the time being in force, and particularly with the provisions in regard to registration of the particulars of mortgages and charges affecting the property of the Company, or created by it, and to keeping a register of the directors and secretaries, and to sending to the

Registrar of Companies an annual list of members, and a summary of particulars relating thereto, and notice of any consolidation or increase of share capital, or conversion of shares into stock, and copies of special and extraordinary resolutions, and a copy of the register of directors and notification of any changes therein.

- 8.1 The directors shall cause minutes to be made in the books provided for the purpose:-
- (a) Of all appointments of officers made by the directors;
 - (b) Of the names of the directors present at each meeting of the directors and of any committee of the directors;
 - (c) Of all resolutions and proceedings at all meetings of the Company, and of the directors, and of committees of directors and every director present at any meeting of directors or committee of directors shall sign his name in a book to be kept for that purpose.

DISQUALIFICATION OF DIRECTORS

82. The Office of any director shall be vacated, if the director.
- (a) Resigns his office by notice in writing to the Company; or
 - (b) Becomes bankrupt in this Territory or in any other territory which is declared to be a reciprocating territory under section 147 of the bankruptcy Ordinance; or
 - (c) Is found lunatic or becomes unsound mind; or
 - (d) Is punished with imprisonment for a term exceeding six months without the option of fine; or
 - (e) Is requested in writing by all his co-directors to resign.
83. Any director or any Company of firm of which a director is a member, may enter into contracts with the Company and any director may vote as a director or shareholder in respect of such contract and retain for his own use profits made by him under any such contract; provided always that unless he be at the time sole director he must disclose his interest to his co-directors before the contract is entered into by the directors, and if he be at the time sole directors be interested contract the contract must be entered into by the Company in general meeting, and before the contract is entered into, the director or directors must disclose his or their interest to the meeting.

PROCEEDINGS OF DIRECTORS

84. The directors may meet together for the dispatch of, adjourn and otherwise regulate their meetings, as they think fit, question arising at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes. In case of any equality of votes the chairman shall have a second or casting vote. A director may, and the secretary on the requisition of a director shall, at any time summon a meeting of the directors.
85. The quorum necessary for the transaction of the business of the directors may be fixed by the directors, and unless so fixed shall be two.
86. The continuing directors may act notwithstanding any vacancy in the body, but, if and so long as their number is reduced below the number fixed by or pursuant to these articles as the quorum of directors, the continuing director may act for the purpose of increasing the number of directors to that number, or summoning a general meeting of the Company, but for no other purpose.
87. The Directors may elect a chairman of their general meeting and determine the period for which he is to hold office; but if no such chairman is elected, or if at any meeting the chairman is not present within five minutes after the time appointed for holding the same, the directors present may choose one of their number to be chairman of their meeting.

88. The directors may delegate any of their powers to committees consisting of such members of their body as they think fit; any committee so formed shall in the exercise of the powers so delegate conform to any regulation that may be imposed on them by the directors.
89. A committee may elect a chairman of their meeting; if no such chairman is elected, or if at any meeting the chairman is not present within five minutes after the time appointed for holding the same, the members present may choose any of their number to be chairman of the meeting.
90. A committee may meet and adjourn as they think proper. Questions arising at any meeting shall determined by a majority of votes of the members present, and in the case if an equality of votes the chairman shall have a second or casting vote.
91. All acts done by any meeting of the directors or of a committee of directors, or any person acting as a director, shall, notwithstanding that it afterwards discovered that there was some defect in the appointment of any such directors or persons acting as aforesaid, or that they or any of them were disqualified, be as valid as if every such person had been duly appointed to be a director.
92. A resolution determined on without any meeting of directors and evidenced by writing under the hands of all directors, or sole director, or of all members of a committee, or of sole member of a committee, shall be as valid and effectual as a resolution duly passed at meeting of the directors or of such committee.

SECRETARY

93. The secretary shall be appointed by the directors for such term, at such remuneration and upon such conditions as they may think fit and any Secretary so appointed may removed by them.
94. No person shall be appointed or hold office as a Secretary who is:-
- (a) the sole director of the Company; or
 - (b) a corporation the sole director of which is the sole director of the Company; or
 - (c) the sole director of a corporation which is the sole director of the Company
95. A provision of the Companies Act 2002 or these regulations requiring or authorizing a thing to be done by or to a director and the secretary shall not be satisfied by its being done by or to the same person acting both as director and as, or in place of the secretary.

THE SEAL

96. The Director shall provide for the safe custody of the seal, which shall only be used by the authority of the directors or of a committee of the directors or of a committee of the directors authorized by the directors in that behalf, and every instrument to which the Seal Secretary or by a second director or by some other person appointed by the directors for the purpose but so that the directors may be resolution determine, either generally or in any particular case, that the signature of any director may be affixed by some mechanical means to be specified in such resolution, provided that the use of such means is by such resolution restricted to certificates which have first been approved for sealing by the Auditors, Transfer Auditors, Transfer Agents or Bankers of the Company in writing.

DIVIDENDS AND RESERVE

97. The Company in general meeting may declare dividends, but no dividend shall exceed the amount recommended by the directors.

98. The directors may from time to time pay to the members such interim dividends as appear to the directors to be justified by the profits of the Company.
99. No dividends shall be paid otherwise than out of profits.
100. Subject to the rights of persons, if any, entitled to shares with special rights as to dividends, all dividends shall be declared and paid according to the amounts paid on the shares, but if and so long as nothing is paid up on any of shares in the Company dividends may be declared and paid according to the amount of the shares. No amount paid on a share in advance of call shall, while carrying interest, be treated for purpose of this article as paid on the share.
101. The directors may, before recommending and dividend, set aside out of the profits of the Company such sums as they think proper as a reserve or reserves which shall, at the discretion of the directors, be applicable for meeting contingencies, or for equalizing dividends, or for any other purpose to which the profits of the Company may be properly applied, and pending such application may, at the like discretion, either be employed in the business of the Company or be invested in such investments (other than shares of the Company) as the directors may from time to time think fit.
102. If several persons are registered as joint holders of any share any one of them may give effectual receipts for any dividends payable on the share.
103. No dividend shall bear interest against the Company.

ACCOUNTS

104. The directors shall cause proper books of accounts to be kept with respect to:-
- All sums of money received and expended by the Company, and the matters in respect of which the receipt and expenditure takes place.
- All sales and purchases of goods by the Company; and The Assets and liabilities of the Company. Proper books of account means such books as are necessary to give a true and fair view of the state of the Company's affairs and to explain its transactions.
105. The books of accounts shall be kept at the registered office of the Company, or at such other place or places as the directors think fit, and shall always be open to the inspection of the directors.
106. The directors shall from time to time determine whether and to what extent and at what time and places and under what conditions or regulations the accounts and books of the Company or any of them shall be open to the inspection of members not being directors, and no member (not being a director) shall have any right of inspecting any account or book or document of the Company except as conferred by statute or authorized by the directors or by the Company in general meeting.
107. The directors shall from time to time in accordance with section 123 of the Companies Act 2002 or any statutory modification thereof for the time being in force, cause to be prepared and to be laid before the Company in general meeting such profit and loss accounts, balance sheet, group accounts (if any) and reports as are referred to in those sections.
108. A copy of every balance sheet (including every document required by the law to be annexed thereto) which is to be laid before the Company in General meeting before the date of the meeting together either a copy of the auditors report, shall not less than twenty one days be sent to every member of, and every holder of debentures of, the Company and to every person registered under regulation 19. Provided that the regulation shall not require a copy of those documents to be sent to any member of whose address the Company is not aware or to more than one of the joint holders of any shares or debentures.

CAPITALISATION OF PROFITS

109. The Company in general meeting may upon the recommendation of the directors resolve that the desirable to capitalize any part of the amount for the time being standing to the credit of any of the Company's reserve accounts or to the credit of the profit and loss account or otherwise available for distribution, and accordingly that such sum be set free for distribution amongst the members who would have been entitled there to distributed by law of dividend and in the same proportions on condition that the same be not paid in cash but be applied either in or towards paying up any amounts for the time being unpaid on any shares held by such members respectively or paying up in full unused shares or debentures of the Company to be allotted and distributed, credited as fully paid up to and amongst such members in the proportion aforesaid, or partly in the one way and partly in the other, and the directors shall give effect to such resolution.

Provided that a share premium account and capital redemption reserve fund my, for the purpose of this regulation, only be applied in the paying up of unused shares to be issued to members of the Company as fully paid bonus shares.

110. Whenever such resolution as aforesaid shall have been passed the directors shall make all appropriations and applications of the undivided profits resolved to be capitalized thereby, and all allotments and issue of fully paid up shares or debentures, if any, and generally shall do all acts and things to give effect thereto, with full power to the directors to make such provision by the issue of fractional certificates or by payment in cash or otherwise as they as they think fit for the case of share of debentures becoming distributable in fractions, and also to authorize any person to enter on behalf of all members entitled thereto into an agreement with the Company providing for the allotment to them respectively, credited as fully paid up, of any other shares or debentures to which they may be entitled up on such capitalization, or (as the case may require) for the payment up by the Company or their behalf, by the application thereto of their respective proportions of the profits of the resolved to be capitalized of the amounts or any part of the amounts remaining unpaid on their existing shares, and may agreement made under such authority shall be effectively and binding on all such members.

AUDIT

111. Auditors shall be appointed and their duties regulated in accordance with the law for the time being governing the business of auditors, specifically of a company like this;
112. If a member has no registered address in Tanzania and has not supplied to the Company an address within The Republic of Tanzania for the giving of notices to him, a notice addressed to him, and displaced in the registered office of the company, shall be deemed to do dully given on the day on which it is so displayed.
113. The company shall have powers to make rules, circulars, and regulations etc. specifically for purposes of governing any matter or activity of the company.

NOTICES

114. A notice may be given by the Company to any member either personally or by sending it by post to him or to his registered address, or (if has registered address in Tanzania, to the address, if any, within Tanzania supplied by him to the Company for the giving of notices to him. Where a notice is sent by post, service of the notice shall be deemed effected by properly addressing, prepaying and posting a letter containing the notice and, unless the contrary is proved, to have been effected at the time at which the letter would be delivered in the ordinary course of post.

- 115 If a member has no registered address in Tanzania and has not supplied to the Company an address within The Republic of Tanzania for the giving of notices to him, a notice addressed to him, and displayed in the registered office of the company, shall be deemed to do dully given on the day on which it is so displayed.
- 116 A notice may be given by the Company to the join holders of a share by giving the notice to the join holder named first in the register in respect of the share.
- 117 A notice may be given by the Company to the persons entitled to a share in consequence of the death or bankruptcy of a member by sending it through the post in a prepaid letter addressed to them by name, or by the title of representatives of the deceased, or trustees of the bankrupt, or by any like description, at the address, if any, in the United Republic of Tanzania supplied for the purpose by the persons claiming to be so entitled, or (until such an address has been so supplied) by giving the notice in any manner in which the same might have been given if the death or bankruptcy had not occurred.
- 118 Notice of any general meeting shall be given in the same manner hereinbefore authorized to (a) every member of the Company except those members who (having no registered address within the United Republic of Tanzania) have not supplied to the Company an address within The United Republic of Tanzania for the giving of notices to them, (b) every person entitled to share in consequence of death or bankruptcy of a member, who, but for his death or bankruptcy, would be entitled to receive notice of the meeting and (c) the auditors for the time being of the company. No other person shall be entitled to receive notices of general meetings.

WINDING UP

- 119 If the Company shall be wound up the liquidator may, with the sanction of an extraordinary resolution of the Company and any other sanction required by the Companies Act 2002 divide amongst the members in specie or kind the whole or any part of the assets of the Company (whether they shall consist of property of the same kind or not) and may, for such purpose set such value as he deems fair upon any property to be divided as aforesaid and may determine how such decision shall be carried out as between the members or different classes of members. The Liquidator may, with sanction, vest the whole or any part of the assets in trustees up on such trusts for the benefit of the contributors as the liquidator, with the like sanction shall think fit, but so that no member shall be compelled to accept any shares or other securities whereon there is any liability.

INDEMNITY

- 120 Subject to the provisions of the Companies Act 2002 every director, managing director, agent, auditor, secretary and other officer for the time being of the Company shall be indemnified any proceedings, whether civil or criminal, in which judgment is given in his favor or in which he is acquitted.
