MEMORANDUM OF ASSOCIATION

OF

NATIONAL LAND COMPANY LIMITED

1. The name of the Company is **NATIONAL LAND COMPANY LIMITED**.
2. The registered office of the Company will be situated in Tanzania.
3. The objects for which the Company is formed are (and it is expressly declared that the several sub-clauses of this clause and all the powers thereof are to be cumulative and in no case is the generality of any one sub-clause nor is any general expression in any sub-clause to be narrowed or restricted by any particularity of expression in the same sub-clause or by the application of any rule of construction *ejusdem generis* or otherwise).
 - (a) To carry on business of Manufacturing Sugar and sugar products.
 - (b) Manufacture of grain mill products, starches and starch products and other food products.
 - (c) To carry on the agricultural business of growing Palm trees, wheat, Sugar cane and any other tropical and subtropical plants/fruits.
 - (d) Owning, Growing of cereals, leguminous crops and oil seeds.
 - (e) To carry on business of manufacturing of Vegetable and animal oil/fat.
 - (f) Carrying out maintenance work pertinent to buildings and properties owned by the Company and by others (third parties), including such maintenance work, the execution of civil, mechanical, electrical, elevator, and air conditioning works and other tasks related to maintenance to ensure the preservation and safety of the buildings.
 - (g) Owning, managing, operating, investing, renting and leasing of hotels, health clubs, motels, guest and rest houses, parks, gardens, galleries, restaurants, cafeterias, residential complexes and facilities, tourist and health resorts, recreation and sport-related projects and shops of various grades standard and levels, including all the original and supporting services and facilities thereto as well as other necessary services within Tanzania.
 - (h) To erect and construct houses, buildings or works of every description on any land of the Company, or upon any other lands or property, and to pull down, rebuild, enlarge, alter and improve existing houses, buildings or works thereon, to convert and appropriate any such land into and for roads, streets, squares, gardens

and pleasure grounds and other conveniences, and generally to deal with and improve the property of the Company or any person.

- (i) To acquire by purchase, lease, exchange, develop, hire or otherwise, either for a right of occupancy or for any other estate, interest or tenure in land, whether in possession or in reversion, and whether vested or contingent, any lands, tenements and premises of any tenure, whether subject or not to any charges or encumbrances, and to hold or to sell, let, alienate, mortgage, charge or otherwise deal with all or any such lands, tenements or premises in the general business of Real Estates.
- (j) To purchase and sell for any person's lands of any tenure or kind or other house property, buildings or lands, or any share or shares, interest or interests therein, and to transact on commission or otherwise the general business of a land agent.
- (k) To undertake or direct the management of the property, buildings lands and estates of any tenure or kind for any persons, whether members of the Company or not, in the capacity of stewards, trustees or receivers or otherwise.
- (l) To Organizing private real estate exhibitions pertinent to the Company's real estate projects.
- (m) Conducting real estate auctions, in accordance with to the applicable regulations of the Ministry
- (n) To let on lease any such premises or parts thereof and to provide such facilities for the occupiers or tenants thereof as are commonly provided in residential flats, business offices or hotels.
- (o) Owning, operating commercial malls and residential complexes
- (p) To carry on the business of builders, architects and surveyors, brick and tile makers, lime-burners, house and estate agents.
- (q) To carry business of information technology which includes network design and installation, software installation and updates, technical IT support, IT budgeting and procurement decisions, IT security and consultancy, information systems audit and remote admin management.
- (r) To apply for and acquire any statutory or other powers, rights or concessions.
- (s) To provide public or private amusements and entertainments upon any property of the Company.
- (t) To advance money to any person or persons or corporation, either at interest or without, upon the security of any movable or immovable property by way of mortgage, or upon marketable security and in particular to advance money to shareholders in the Company, and others, upon the security of or for the purpose of enabling the person borrowing the same to erect, or purchase, or enlarge or repair any house or building, or to purchase any estate or interest in, or to take a demise for any term or terms of years of any property upon such terms and

- conditions s the Company may think fit.
- (u) To lend or advance money to builders and other persons on securities of all descriptions, whether real or personal, and to grant loans upon mortgage of any lands, buildings and premises, of whatever tenure, for the improvement thereof or otherwise.
 - (v) To undertake and carry on the office or offices and duties of trustee custodian trustee executor administrator liquidator receiver committee attorney or nominee of or for any person Company corporation association government state municipal or other body politic or corporate.
 - (w) For the purposes aforesaid to apply for and acquire and hold any charters Acts of Parliament monopolies licenses concessions, patents or other rights powers or orders from the Tanzania Government and Parliament or from any other government or state, or any local or other authority in any part of the world and to exercise carry on and work any powers rights privileges so obtained and to constitute or incorporate the Company as an anonymous or other society in a foreign country or state.
 - (x) To carry on the business of surveyors, valuers, managers or agents of surveyors, valuers and managers of real estates.
 - (y) To buy and sell immovable property, movable property, chattels, goods, stock, shares and any kind of property, whether movable or immovable and whether of a speculative nature or otherwise, and also to hire and lease any kind of property or things, movable or immovable.
 - (z) In the matters and for the purposes aforesaid to act solely or jointly with any other person company corporation or body as the circumstances may require.
 - (aa) To carry on business as manufacturers, manufacturers representatives, agents, factors of representatives or manufacturers, importers and suppliers/distributors of all types of computers, computer software and hardware, its peripherals, accessories and other computer related items as well as all kinds of software package.
 - (bb) To establish and manage the business or businesses of merchants, traders, dealers and suppliers, whether wholesale or retail, of all kind of ironware, ironmongery, tools, machinery and agricultural implements and machinery and to buy, sell, repair, convert, alter, let or hire, and deal in any of the foregoing goods, commodities, plant and machinery, to carry on the business of iron founders, mechanical and electrical engineers, manufacturers of agricultural implements and other machinery, tool maker, metal workers, boiler makers, millwrights, machinists, smiths, woodworkers and builders.
 - (cc) To sell, improve, manage, develop, lease, mortgage, dispose of, turn to account, or otherwise deal with all or any part of the present or future property or rights of the Company.

- (dd) To carry on the business as general merchants, universal providers, universal exporters and importers, universal wholesalers and retailers of all commodities and/or goods of whatever description.
- (ee) To carry on and to undertake any business transactions or operations commonly carried on or undertaken by promoters of companies, financiers, concessionaires, contractors for public and other works, capitalists, merchants or traders, and to carry on other business which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with any of its objects, or calculated, directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the Company's property or rights.
- (ff) To enter into any arrangement for sharing profits, union of interest, amalgamation, joint venture, reciprocal concession or otherwise with any person or company carrying on or about to carry on any business or transaction capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit this Company and to take or otherwise acquire shares, debentures, and securities of any such company, and to sell, hold, re-issue with or without guarantee or otherwise deal with the same.
- (gg) To sell or let the undertaking of the Company or any part thereof for such consideration as the Company may think fit and in particular for shares, debentures or securities of any other company.
- (hh) Generally to purchase, take on lease or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire any movable or immovable property, and any rights or privileges which the company may think necessary or convenient for the purpose of its business and in particular any land leases, options over lands or leases, stands, buildings, servitudes, machinery, plant and also any concessions, licenses, trademarks, and other rights in Africa or elsewhere, and either solely or jointly with others and to pay therefore in cash or in stock or in shares of the company or partly in cash and partly in stock or shares or otherwise.
- (ii) To invest and deal with the moneys of the company not immediately required upon such securities and in such manner as may from time to time be determined.
- (jj) To make, accept, endorse, execute and issue promissory notes, bills of exchange and other negotiable instruments for the purpose of the Company's business.
- (kk) To raise money in such manner as the Company shall think fit and in particular by the issue of debentures, perpetual or otherwise charged upon all of any of the Company's property and rights both present and future.
- (ll) To sell, improve, manage, develop, lease, mortgage, and dispose of, turn to account or otherwise deal with all or any part of the present or future property or rights of the Company.
- (mm) To make any sale, mortgage, lease, sub-lease, or other disposition of the undertaking in whole or in part of the property of the Company in such manner and on such terms and conditions, at such rent, for such purpose and for such



consideration whether cash, shares, bonds, debentures or securities of any other Company having objects altogether or in part similar to analogous to those of this Company or otherwise as may be deemed advantageous or desirable and to divide by way of bonus or otherwise, any such considerations in any shares, debentures or stocks held or received by this Company amongst the members of this Company.

- (nn) To pay all the costs and expenses of and incidental to the formation and registration of the Company.
- (oo) To do all or any part of the above things in any part of the world as principals or agents, and by or through agents either alone or in conjunction with others.
- (pp) To deal with any unappropriated shares by way of bonus compensation, sale or in any way whatsoever that may appear to be to the advantage of the Company.
- (qq) To adopt such means of making known the products of the Company as may seem expedient, and in particular by advertising in the press, by circulars, by purchase and exhibition of works and interest by publication of books and periodicals and by granting prizes, rewards and donations.
- (rr) To establish and support or aid in the establishment and support of associations, institutions, and conveniences calculated to benefit any of the employees or ex-employees of the Company or the dependents or connections of such persons and to grant pensions and allowances, and to make payments towards insurance, and to subscribe, underwrite, form or guarantee money for charitable or benevolent objects or for any exhibition or for any public general or useful object.

It is hereby declared that the word “**Company**” save when used in reference to this Company, in this clause shall be deemed to include any partnership or other body or persons, whether domiciled in East Africa or elsewhere.

4. The liability of the members is limited.
5. The Share Capital of the Company is **Tanzanian Shillings Five Billion (T.shs. 5,000,000,000/=)** divided into **One Hundred (100)** Ordinary Shares of **Tanzanian Shillings Fifty Million (T.shs. 50,000,000/=)** each with such rights, privileges or conditions as may be determined by or in accordance with the regulations of the Company, and to vary, modify or abrogate any such rights, privileges or conditions in such manner as may for the time being be provided by the regulations of the Company.

WE, the several persons, whose names, address and descriptions are subscribed, are desirous of being formed into a Company in pursuance of this Memorandum of Association and we respectively agree to take the number of shares in the capital of the Company set opposite our respective names.



THE COMPANIES ACT No. 12 OF 2002

PRIVATE COMPANY LIMITED BY SHARES

*Articles of Association
of*

NATIONAL LAND COMPANY LIMITED

1. The regulations in Part II Table "A" in the First Schedule to the Companies Act, No. 12 of 2002 shall not apply to the Company.
2. In these presents, if not inconsistent with the subject or context, the words standing in the first column of the table next hereinafter contained shall bear the meanings set opposite to them respectively in the second column thereof.

The Companies Act, No. 12 of 2002, and every other enactment for the time being in force concerning companies and affecting the Company.

“Dividend”

Dividend and/or bonus.

“Month”

Calendar month.

“Office”

The Registered Office of the Company.

These Articles of Association, as now framed, or as from time to time altered by Special Resolution.

“Seal”

The Common Seal of the Company.

“Writing”

Unless the contrary intention appears, "writing" shall be construed as including references to printing, lithography, photography, and other modes of representing or reproducing words in a visible form.

“Year” Calendar year.

The expressions "**Debenture**" and "**Debenture holder**" shall include "**Debenture Stock**" and "**Debenture Stockholder**", and the expression "**Secretary**" shall include a temporary or assistant Secretary and any person appointed by the Directors to perform any of the duties of the Secretary.

Save as aforesaid any words or expressions defined in the Act shall, if not inconsistent with the subject or context, bear the same meaning in these presents.

The marginal notes are inserted for convenience only and shall not affect the construction of these presents.

Words importing the singular number only shall include the plural and the converse shall also apply.

Words importing males shall include females.

3. The Company is a private company and accordingly: -

- (a) The right to transfer shares is restricted in manner hereinafter prescribed. Private Company
- (b) the members of the company (exclusive of persons who are in the employment of the Company) is limited to fifty, PROVIDED THAT, where two or more persons hold one or more shares in the Company jointly, they shall, for the purpose of this Article, be treated as a single member;
- (c) any invitation to the public to subscribe for any shares or debentures of the company is prohibited;
- (d) The Company shall not have power to issue share warrants to bearer.

SHARE CAPITAL

4. The Share Capital of the Company at the date of registration of these Articles is **Tanzanian Shillings Five Billion (T.shs. 5,000,000,000/=)** divided into **One Hundred (100)** Ordinary Shares of **Tanzanian Shillings Fifty Million (T.shs. 50,000,000/=)** each. Share Capital

LOANS BY THE COMPANY

5. No part of the funds of the Company shall be employed in the purchase of or in loans upon the security of the Company's shares. The Company shall not, except as authorized by the Act, give any financial assistance for the purpose of or in connection with any purchase of share in the Company.

Company's own shares not to be purchased

RIGHTS OF SHARES HOLDERS

6. Without prejudice to any special rights previously conferred on the holders of any shares or class of shares already issued (which special rights shall not be modified or abrogated except with such consent or sanction as is provided by article 7 below, any share in the Company (whether forming part of the original capital or not) may be issued with such preferred, deferred or other special rights, or such restrictions, whether in regard to dividend, return of capital, voting or otherwise, as the Company may from time to time by ordinary resolution determine, and subject to the provisions of the Act the Company may issue Preference Shares which are, or which at the option of the Company are to be, liable to be redeemed.

Issue of shares subject to special conditions

MODIFICATION OF RIGHTS

7. Whenever the capital of the Company is divided into different classes of shares, the special rights attached to any class may, subject to the provisions of the Act, be modified or abrogated, either with the consent in writing of the holders of three-fourths of the issued shares of the class, or with the sanction of a Special Resolution passed at a separate General Meeting of such holders (but not otherwise), and may be so modified or abrogated either whilst the Company is a going concern or during or in contemplation of a winding up. To every such separate General Meeting all the provisions of these presents relating to General Meetings of the Company or to the proceedings thereat, shall *mutatis mutandis*, apply, except that the necessary quorum shall be two persons at least holding or representing by proxy one-half in nominal amount of the issued shares of the class (but so that if at any adjourned meeting of such holders a quorum as above defined is not present, those Members who are present shall be a quorum), and that the holders of shares of the class shall, on a poll, have one vote in respect of every shares of the class held by them respectively.

How rights of shares may be modified

SHARES

8. Subject to the provisions of Article 38, unissued shares shall be at the disposal of the Directors, and they may allot, grant options over, or otherwise dispose of them to such persons, at such times, and on such terms as they think proper, but so that no shares shall be issued at a discount, except in accordance with the Act. Unissued shares at the disposal of Directors
9. In addition to all other powers of paying commissions, the Company (or the Directors on behalf of the Company) may exercise the powers of paying commissions conferred by the Act, provided that the rate per cent, or the amount of the commission paid or agreed to be paid, shall be disclosed in the manner required by the Act and the rate of the commission shall not exceed the rate of ten per cent (10%) of the price at which the shares in respect of which the commission is paid are issued or an amount equivalent thereto. The Company (or the Directors on behalf of the Company) may also on any issue of shares pay such brokerage as may be lawful. Power to pay commission and brokerage
10. Shares may be held in the Company in trust for beneficial owner. Trustee shares

CERTIFICATES

11. Every person whose name is entered as a Member in the Register of Members shall be entitled without payment to receive within two months after allotment or lodgement of transfer (or within such other period as the conditions of issue shall provide) one certificate for all his shares of any one class or several certificates each for one or more of his shares upon payment of such sum, as the Directors shall from time to time determine. Every certificate shall be issued under the Seal. The certificate shall specify the shares or securities to which it relates and the amount paid up thereon. Provided that the Company shall not be bound to register more than three persons as the joint holders of any shares (except in the case of executors of trustees of a deceased Member), and, in case of a share or shares held jointly by several persons, the Company shall not be bound to issue more than one certificate therefore, and delivery of a certificate for a share to one of several joint holders shall be sufficient delivery to all such holders. Issue of Certificates
12. If a share certificate be worn out, defaced, lost or destroyed, it may be renewed on payment of such fee (if any) and on such terms (if any) as to evidence, indemnity and the payment of out-of pocket expenses of the Company for investigating evidence, as the Directors think fit. Renewal of Certificates

LIEN

13. The Company shall have a first and paramount lien on every shares for all moneys (whether presently payable or not) called or payable at a fixed time in respect of such share; and the Company shall also have a first and paramount lien and charge on all shares (including fully paid shares) standing registered in the name of each Member (whether solely or jointly with others) for all the debts and liabilities of such Member or his estate to the Company and that whether the same shall have been incurred before or after notice to the Company of any equitable or other interest in any person other than such Member, and whether the period for the payment or discharge or the same shall have actually arrived or not and notwithstanding that the same are joint debts or liabilities of such Member or his estate and any other person, whether a Member of the Company or not. The Company's lien (if any) on a share shall extend to all dividends payable thereon but the Directors may at any time declare any share to be exempt wholly or partially from the provisions of this Article.
- Company's lien
14. The Company may sell, in such manner as the Directors think fit, any share on which the Company has a lien, but no sale shall be made unless a sum in respect of which the lien exists is presently payable, nor until the expiration of fourteen days after a notice in writing, stating and demanding payment of the sum presently payable, and giving notice of intention to sell in default, shall have been given to the holder for the time being of the share or the person entitled by reason of his death or bankruptcy to the shares. For giving effect to any such sale, the Directors may authorize some person to transfer the shares sold to the purchaser thereof. The purchaser shall be registered as the holder of the shares comprised in such transfer, and he shall not be bound to see to the application of the purchase money, nor shall his title to the shares be affected by any irregularity or invalidity in the proceedings in reference to the sale.

15. The net proceeds of such sale after payment of the costs of such sale shall be applied in or towards payment or satisfaction of the debt or liability in respect whereof the lien exists, so far as the same is presently payable and any residue shall (subject to a like lien for debts or liabilities not presently payable as existed upon the shares prior to the sale) be paid to the person entitled to the shares at the time of the sale.

TRANSFER OF SHARES

23. (a) Subject to the restrictions of these presents, all transfers of shares may be effected by transfer in writing in the usual common form or in any other form in writing under hand approved by the Directors. Form of transfer
- (b) The instrument of transfer of a share shall be in writing and shall be signed by or on behalf of the transferor and transferee, and the transferor shall be deemed to remain the holder of the share until the name of the transferee is entered in the Register of Members in respect thereof, provided that the Directors may dispense with the execution of the instrument of transfer by the transferee in any case in which they think fit in their discretion so to do. Execution
24. The Director may, subject to compliance with the requirements of the Act as to advertisement, suspend the registration of transfers at such time and for such periods as they may from time to time determine, but so that such registration shall not be suspended for more than Thirty days in any year. Director's refusal to register, and closing register
25. All instruments of transfer which shall be registered shall be retained by the Company but any instrument of transfer which the Directors may decline to register shall on demand be returned to the person depositing it with the Company. Custody of instruments of transfer
- The Directors may decline to recognise any instrument of transfer unless:-
- (a) Such fee, as the Directors may from time to time require, is paid to the Company in respect thereof; and
- (b) The instrument of transfer is deposited at the Office or such other place as the Director may appoint, accompanied by the certificate of the shares to which it relates, and such other evidence as the Directors may reasonably require to show the right of the transferor to make the transfer.

TRANSMISSION OF SHARES

26. In case of the death of a Member the survivors or survivor where the deceased was a joint holder, and the executors or administrators of the deceased where he was a sole or only surviving holder shall be the only persons recognized by the Company as having any title to his shares; but nothing herein contained shall release the estate of a deceased holder (whether sole or joint) from any liability in respect of any share solely or jointly held by him. Transmission on death
27. Any person becoming entitled to a share in consequence of the death or bankruptcy of a Member may, upon such evidence as to his title being produced as may from time to time be required by the Directors, and subject as hereinafter provided, either be registered himself as holder of the share or elect to have some person nominated by him registered as the transferee thereof. Registration of Execution and Trustees in Bankruptcy
28. If the person so becoming entitled shall elect to be registered himself, he shall deliver or send to the Company a notice in writing signed by him stating that he so elects. If he shall elect to have his nominee registered, he shall testify his election by executing to his nominee a transfer of such share. All the limitations, restrictions and provisions of these presents relating to the right to transfer and the registration of transfer of shares shall be applicable to any such notice or transfer as aforesaid as if the death or bankruptcy of the Member had not occurred and the notice or transfer were a transfer executed by such Member. Notice of Election to be registered and registration of nominee
29. A person becoming entitled to a share in consequence of the death or bankruptcy of a Member shall be entitled to receive and may give a discharge for all dividends and other moneys payable in respect of the shares, but he shall not be entitled to receive notice of or to attend or vote at meetings of the Company or, save as aforesaid, to any of the rights or privileges of a Member until he shall have become a Member in respect of the share, and should he fail either to transfer the share or to elect to be registered as a Member in respect thereof within sixty days of being required so to do by the Directors, he shall in the case of shares which are fully paid up be deemed to have elected to be registered as a Member in respect thereof, and may be registered accordingly. FORFEITURE OF SHARES

30. If a Member fails to pay the whole or any part of any call or instalment of a call on the day appointed for payment thereof, the Directors may, at any time thereafter during such time as any part of such call or instalment remains unpaid, serve a notice on him Notice requiring payment of Calls

If the requirements of any such notice as aforesaid are not complied with, any share in respect of which such notice has been given may at any time thereafter, before payment of all calls and interest and expenses due in respect thereof has been made, be forfeited by a resolution of the Directors to that effect. Such forfeiture shall include all dividends declared in respect of the forfeited shares and not actually paid before forfeiture. Forfeiture on non-compliance with notice

33. When any share has been forfeited in accordance with these presents, notice of the forfeiture shall forthwith be given to the holder of the share, or the person entitled to the share by transmission, as the case may be, and an entry of such notice having been given and of the forfeiture with the date thereof shall forthwith be made in the Register of Members opposite to the entry of the shares; but no forfeiture shall be in any manner invalidated by any accidental omission or neglect to give such notice or to make such entry as aforesaid. Notice after forfeiture

34. A forfeited share shall become the property of the Company and may be sold, re-allotted or otherwise disposed of, either to the person who was, before forfeiture, the holder thereof or entitled thereto, or to any other person, upon such terms and in such manner as the Directors shall think fit, and at any time before a sale, re-allotment or disposition, the forfeiture may be cancelled on such terms as the Directors think fit. The Directors may if necessary, authorise some person to transfer a forfeited share to any such other person as aforesaid. Sale of forfeited shares

35. A person whose shares have been forfeited shall cease to be a Member in respect of the forfeited shares, but shall, notwithstanding the forfeiture, remain liable to pay to the Company all moneys which, at the date of the forfeiture, were payable by him to the Company in respect of the shares, with interest thereon as shall be determined by the Directors from the date of forfeiture until Rights and liabilities of Members whose shares have been forfeited

36. A statutory declaration in writing that the declarant is a Director or the Secretary of the Company, and that a share has been duly forfeited on the date stated in the declaration shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated as against all persons claiming to be entitled to the share, and such declaration and the receipt of the Company for the consideration (if any) given for the share on the sale, re-allotment or disposal thereof together with the certificate of proprietorship of the share under seal delivered to a purchaser or allottee thereof shall (subject to the execution of a transfer if the same be required) constitute a good title to the share, and the person to whom the share is sold, re-allotted or disposed of, shall be registered as the holder of the share and shall not be bound to see to the application of the purchase money (if any) nor shall his title to the share be affected by any irregularity or invalidity in the proceedings in reference to the forfeiture, sale, re-allotment or disposal of the share.

37. The Company may from time to time by Ordinary Resolution increase its share capital by such sum to be divided into shares of such amount as the resolution shall prescribe.

40. The Company may by Ordinary Resolution:-
- (a) Consolidate and divide all or any of its share capital into shares of larger amount than its existing shares.

- (b) Cancel any shares which, at the date of the passing of the resolution, have not been taken, or agreed to be taken by any person, and diminish the amount of its capital by the amount of the shares so cancelled. Power to cancel shares
- (c) Sub-divide its shares, or any of them, into shares of smaller amount than is fixed by the Memorandum of Association (subject, nevertheless, to the provisions of the Act), and so that the resolution whereby any share is sub-divided may determine that, as between the holders of the shares resulting from such sub-division, one or more of the shares may have any such preferred or other special rights over, or may have such deferred rights, or be subject to any such restrictions as compared with the others as the Company has power to attach to unissued or new shares. 41. The Company may by Ordinary Resolution convert any paid-up shares into stock, and reconvert any stock into paid-up shares of any denomination. Conversion into stock
42. The holders of stock may transfer the same, or any part thereof in the same manner, and subject to the same regulations as and subject to which the shares from which the stock arose might previously to conversion have been transferred, or as near thereto as circumstances admit; and the Directors may from time to time fix the minimum amount of stock transferable but so that such minimum shall not exceed the nominal amount of the shares from which the stock arose. 43. The holders of stock shall, according to the amount of stock held by them, have the same rights, privileges and advantages as regards dividends, voting at meetings of the Company and other matters as if they held the shares from which the stock arose, but no such privileges or advantage (except participation in the dividends and profits of the Company and in the assets on winding up) shall be conferred by an amount of stock which would not, if existing in shares, have conferred that privilege or advantage. GENERAL MEETINGS

45. (a) A General Meeting shall be held as the Annual General Meeting once in every year, at such time (within a period of not more than fifteen months after the holding of the last preceding Annual General Meeting) and place as may be determined by the Directors. The General Meetings referred to in this Article shall be called "Annual General Meetings". All General Meetings other than Annual General Meetings shall be called "Extraordinary Meetings".

With the consent in writing of all Members entitled to receive notices from the Company, a meeting may be convened by a shorter notice and in such manner as such Members may think fit.

PROCEEDINGS AT GENERAL MEETINGS

49. All business shall be deemed special that is transacted at an Extraordinary Meeting, and also all business that is transacted at an Annual General Meeting, with the exception of declaring dividends, the reading and consideration of the accounts and balance sheet and the ordinary reports of the Directors and documents required to be annexed to the balance sheet, the election of directors and appointment of Auditors and other officers in the place of those retiring by rotation or otherwise, the fixing of the remuneration of the Auditors and the voting of remuneration or extra remuneration to the Directors. Special business
50. Any person entitled to be present and vote at a meeting may submit any resolution or amendment to the meeting, provided that at least five and not more than fourteen clear days before the day appointed for the meeting he shall have served upon the Company a notice in writing signed by him, containing the proposed resolution or amendment and stating his intention to submit the same. 51. Upon receipt of any such notice as in the last proceeding Article mentioned, the Secretary shall include in the notice of the meeting in any case where the notice of intention is received before the notice of the meeting is issued, and shall in any other case issue as quickly as possible to the Members notice that such resolution or amendments will be proposed. Any resolution or amendment of which such notice has not been given shall in the case of a resolution and may in the case of an amendment be ruled out of order, and the ruling of the Chairman shall be conclusive. 52. No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting unless a quorum is present when the meeting proceeds to business; save as herein otherwise provided two members present in person or by proxy shall be a quorum for all purposes. Quorum
53. If within half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting a quorum is not present, the meeting, if convened on the requisition of Members, shall be dissolved. In any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and place or to such other day and at such other time and place as the Directors may determine, and if at such adjourned meeting a quorum is not present within fifteen minutes from the time Adjournment if quorum not present

appointed for holding the meeting, the Members present in person or by proxy shall be a quorum.

54. The Chairman of the Board of Directors if any shall preside as Chairman at every General Meeting of the Company. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present within fifteen minutes after the time appointed for holding the meeting, or be unwilling to act as Chairman, the Members present shall choose some Director, or if no Director be present, or if all the Directors present decline to take the chair, they shall choose some Member present to be Chairman.
55. The Chairman may with the consent of any meeting at which a quorum is present (and shall if so directed by the meeting), adjourn the meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting except business which might lawfully have been transacted at the meeting from which the adjournment took place. When a meeting is adjourned for fourteen days or more, notice of the adjourned meeting shall be given as in the case of an original meeting. Save as aforesaid, it shall not be necessary to give any notice of an adjournment or of the business to be transacted at an adjourned meeting.
56. At any General Meeting a resolution put to the vote of the meeting shall be decided on a show of hands unless a poll is (before or on the declaration of the result of the show of hands) demanded by the Chairman or by at least two Members present in person or by proxy and entitled to vote, or by a Member or Members entitled either by reason of their own holding or as representatives or as proxies, to cast one-tenth or more of the votes which could be cast in respect of that resolution if all persons entitled to vote thereon were present at the meeting. Unless a poll is so demanded, a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried, or carried unanimously, or by a particular majority, or lost, or not carried, and an entry to that effect in the minute book shall be conclusive evidence of the fact without proof of the number or proportion of the votes recorded in favour of or against such resolution.
57. If any votes shall be counted which ought not to have been counted, or might have been rejected, the error shall not vitiate the resolution unless the same be pointed out at the same meeting, or at any adjournment thereof, and not in that case unless it shall in the opinion of the Chairman of the meeting be of sufficient magnitude to vitiate the resolution.

74. The Directors shall be paid out of the funds of the Company by way of remuneration for their services, such sum as the Company in General Meeting may from time to time determine. The Directors shall also be paid all reasonable traveling, hotel and other expenses incurred by them in connection with attending and returning from Board Meetings or otherwise in connection with the business of the Company.

Extra remuneration

75. Any Director who serves on any committee or who devotes special attention to the business of the Company or who otherwise performs services which, in the opinion of the Board, are outside the scope of the ordinary duties of a Director, may be paid such extra remuneration by way of salary, percentage of profits or otherwise as the Board may determine, which shall be charged as part of the Company's ordinary working expenses.

Vacation of office of Directors

76. The office of a Director shall be vacated in any of the following events, namely:-
- (a) If (not being an Executive Director holding office as such for a fixed term) he resigns his office by writing under his hand left at the Office.
 - (b) If he has a receiving order made against him or compounds with his creditors.

- (c) If he be found lunatic or of unsound mind.
- (d) If he be absent from meetings of the Directors for six months without leave and the Directors resolve that, by reason of such absence, his office be vacated.
- (e) If he be removed from office pursuant to Article 82.

77. A Director may hold any other office or place of profit under the Company (other than the office of Auditor) and may act in a professional capacity for the Company in conjunction with his office of Director, on such terms as to remuneration and otherwise as the Board may determine, and no Director or intending Director shall be disqualified by his office from contracting with the Company, either with regard to his tenure of any such other office or place of profit, or as vendor, purchaser or otherwise, nor shall any such contract, or any contract arrangement entered into by or on behalf of the Company in which any Director is in any way interested be liable to be avoided, nor shall any Director so contracting or being so interested be liable to account to the Company for any profit realised by any such contract or arrangement by reason of such Director holding that office, or of the fiduciary relating thereby established, provided that the nature of the interest of the Director in such contract or proposed contract or arrangement be declared at the meeting of the Directors at which the question is first taken into consideration if his interest then exists, or in any other case at the next meeting of the Directors held after he became interested. A Director may vote in respect of any contract or arrangement in which he is interested and be counted in ascertaining whether a quorum is present, provided that he gives notice of the nature of his interest in any such contract or arrangement in the same manner as aforesaid. A general notice given to the Board by a Director to the effect that he is a member of or beneficially interested in a specified firm or company and is to be regarded as interested in any contracts or arrangements which may be made with that firm or company after the date of such notice shall be sufficient declaration of interest under this Article.

91. (a) The Directors may meet together for dispatch of business adjourn and otherwise regulate their meetings as they think fit. 92. The quorum necessary for the transaction of the business of the Directors may be fixed by the Directors, and unless so fixed at any other number shall be two. Quorum
93. The continuing Directors may act notwithstanding any vacancies in the Board, but if and so long as the number of Directors is reduced below the minimum number fixed by or in accordance with these presents, the continuing Directors or Director may act for the purpose of filling up vacancies in the Board or of summoning General Meetings of the Company, but not for any other purpose. If there be no Directors or Director able or willing to act, then any shareholder may summon a General Meeting of shareholders for the purpose of appointing Directors. Proceedings in case of vacancies
94. The Chairman of the Board shall preside at all meetings of the Members. If at any meeting the Chairman shall be not present within fifteen minutes after the time appointed for holding the same, the Directors present may choose one of their members to be Chairman of the meeting. Chairman
95. A resolution in writing, signed by all the Directors for the time being, shall be effective as a resolution passed at a meeting of the Directors duly convened and held, and may consist of several documents in the like form, each signed by one or more of the Directors. Resolutions in writing
96. A meeting of the Directors for the time being, at which a quorum is present, shall be competent to exercise all powers and discretion for the time being exercisable by the Directors. Powers of meeting at which a quorum is present
97. Without prejudice and in addition to the Provisions of Article 83, the Directors may delegate any of their powers to committees consisting of such number of members of their body as they think fit. Any committee so formed shall in the exercise of the powers so delegated conform to any regulations that may be imposed on them by the Directors. Power to appoint committees
98. The meetings and proceedings of any such committee, consisting of two or more members, shall be governed by the provisions of these presents regulating the meetings and proceedings of the Directors, so far as the same are applicable and are not superseded by any regulations made by the Directors under the last preceding Article. Proceedings at committee meetings

99. All acts done by any meeting of Directors, or of a committee of Directors, or by any person acting as a Director, shall as regards all persons dealing in good faith with the Company, notwithstanding that there was some defect in the appointment of any such Director, or person acting as aforesaid, or that they or any of them were disqualified, or had vacated office or were not entitled to vote, be as valid as if every such person had been duly appointed, and was qualified and had continued to be a Director and had been entitled to vote.

ALTERNATE DIRECTORS

100. Any Director may at any time appoint any person approved by the Board to be an Alternate Director of the Company and may at any time remove any Alternate Director so appointed by him from office. An Alternate Director so appointed shall not be entitled to receive any remuneration from the Company or to appoint an Alternate, but shall otherwise be subject to the provisions of these presents with regard to Directors. An alternate Director shall be entitled to receive notices of all meetings of the Board, and to attend and vote as a Director at any such meeting at which the Director appointing him is not personally present, and generally to perform all the functions of his appointor as a Director in the absence of such appointor. An Alternate shall ipso facto cease to be an Alternate Director if his appointor ceases for any reason to be a Director. All appointments and removals of Alternate Directors shall be effected by writing under the hand of the Director making or revoking such appointment left at the office.

MINUTES

101. The Directors shall cause proper minutes to be made in books to be provided for the purpose of all appointments of officers made by the Directors, of the proceedings of all meetings of Directors and committees of Directors and of the attendances thereat, and of the proceedings of all meetings of the Company and all business transacted, resolutions passed and orders made at such meetings, and any such minute of such meetings if purporting to be signed by the Chairman of such meeting, or by the Chairman of the next succeeding meeting of the Company or Directors or committee, as the case may be, shall be sufficient evidence without any further proof of the facts therein stated.

THE SEAL

Formalities for
affixing seal

102. The Seal of the Company shall not be affixed to any instrument except by the authority of a resolution of the Board and shall be so affixed in the presence of at least one Director and the Secretary or some other person approved by the Board, both of whom shall sign every instrument to which the Seal is so affixed in their presence.

AUTHENTICATION OF DOCUMENTS

103. Any Director or the Secretary or any person appointed by the Directors for the purpose shall have power to authenticate any documents affecting the constitution of the Company (including the Memorandum and Articles of Association) and any resolutions passed by the Company or the Board, and any books, records, documents and accounts relating to the business of the Company, and to certify copies thereof or extracts therefrom as true copies or extracts, and where any books, records, documents or accounts are else where than at the Office, the local manager or other officer of the Company having the custody thereof shall be deemed to be a person appointed by the Directors as aforesaid.

DIVIDENDS

104. Subject to any special rights as to dividend attached to any new class of shares in accordance with these presents, the profits of the Company available for dividend and resolved to be distributed in respect of any financial year or other period for which the Company's accounts are made up and submitted to the Company in General Meeting shall be apportioned and paid to the Members according to the amounts paid on the shares held by them respectively during any portion or portions of the period in respect of which the dividend is paid but if any share is issued on terms providing that it shall rank for dividends as from a particular date, such share shall rank for dividends accordingly.
105. No dividend shall be payable except out of the profits of the Company, or in excess of the amount recommended by the Directors.
106. Any General Meeting declaring a dividend may resolve that such dividend be paid wholly or in part by the distribution of specific assets, and in particular of paid up shares, debentures or debenture stock of the Company, or paid up shares, debentures or debenture stock of any other company, or in any one or more of such ways.
107. If and so far as in the opinion of the Directors the profits of the

other purposes as the Directors may in their discretion think conducive to the interests of the Company, and the Directors may invest the sums standing to the Capital Reserve in such investments as they think fit, other than shares or stock of the Company, and may from time to time deal with or vary such investments and dispose of all or any part thereof with full power to employ the Capital Reserve in the business of the Company, and that without keeping it separate from the other assets and with power to divide the said Capital Reserve into separate accounts or funds if they think fit.

CAPITALIZATION OF PROFITS AND RESERVES

114. The Company in General Meeting may, upon the recommendation of the Directors, resolve that it is desirable to capitalise any undivided profits of the Company not required for paying the fixed dividends or Preference Shares if any (including profits carried and standing to the credit of any reserve or reserves or other special account), and accordingly that the Directors be authorised and directed to appropriate the profits resolved to be capitalised to the Members in the proportions in which such profits would have been divisible amongst them had the same been applied in paying dividends instead of being capitalised, and to apply such profits on their behalf, either in or towards paying up the amounts, if any, for the time being unpaid on any shares held by such Members respectively, or in paying up in full unissued shares, debentures or securities of the Company of a nominal amounts equal to such profits, such shares, debentures or securities to be allotted and distributed credited as fully paid up, to and amongst such Members in the proportion aforesaid, or partly in one way and partly in the other.

ACCOUNTS

115. The Directors shall cause proper books of account to be kept with respect to:-
- Directors to keep proper accounts
- (a) all sums of money received and expended by the Company and the matters in respect of which such receipt and expenditure takes place;
 - (b) all sales and purchases of goods by the Company; and
 - (b) the assets and liabilities of the Company.

116. The books of account shall be kept at the Office or at such other place as the Directors think fit, and shall always be open to the inspection of the Directors. No Member (other than a Director) shall have any right of inspecting any account or book or document of the Company except as conferred by the Act or authorised by the Directors or by the Company in General Meeting. Inspection of books
117. The Directors shall once at least in every year lay before the Company in General Meeting a profit and loss account and a balance sheet containing a general summary of the capital, the assets, and the liabilities of the Company arranged under suitable heads, both made up to a date not more than six months before the meeting. Submission of balance sheets and profits and loss account
118. Every such balance sheet as aforesaid shall be signed on behalf of the Board by two of the Directors, and shall have attached to it a report of the Directors as to the state of the Company's affairs and the amount which they recommend to be paid by way of dividend to the Members, and the amount (if any) which they have carried or propose to carry to the Capital Reserve, Fund, general reserve or reserve account shown specifically on the balance sheet or to be shown specifically on a subsequent balance sheet. The balance sheet shall also have attached or annexed to it, the Auditors' report and such other documents as the Act may require. Signature of balance sheets

AUDIT

119. The Company shall at each Annual General Meeting appoint an Auditor or Auditors to hold office until the next ensuing Annual General Meeting. The Auditor's report shall be read before the Company at the Annual General Meeting and shall be open to inspection by any Member. The Auditors' duties shall be regulated in accordance with the Act. Appointment of Auditors
120. Neither Director or other officer of the Company nor any person who is a partner of or in the employment of an officer of the Company, or any corporation, shall be capable of being appointed Auditor of the Company. Directors not be Auditors

NOTICES

121. Any notice or document may be served by the Company on any Member wherever resident either personally or by fax or telex or by sending it through the post in a prepaid letter addressed to such Member at his registered address as appearing in the Register of Members, provided that if such address is outside Tanzania, such letter shall be sent by air mail. In respect of joint holdings, all notices shall be given to that one of the joint holders whose name stands first in the Register of Members, and notice so given shall be sufficient notice to all the joint holders. Service of Notices
122. Any notice or other document, if sent by telefax or telex shall be deemed to have been served as soon as the message has been transmitted, and if served by post, shall be deemed to have been served Ninety-six hours after the letter containing the same is posted, and in proving such service it shall be sufficient to prove that the letter containing the notice or document was properly addressed, stamped and posted. Proof of postage to be sufficient proof of service
123. Any notice or document delivered or sent by post to or left at the registered address of any Member in pursuance of these presents shall, notwithstanding that such Member be then dead or bankrupt, and whether or not the Company have notice of his death or bankruptcy, be deemed to have been duly served in respect of any share registered in the name of such Member as sole or joint holder, and such service shall for all purposes be deemed a sufficient service of such notice or document on all persons interested (whether jointly with or as claiming through or under him) in the share. Service to be sufficient notwithstanding death or bankruptcy of Member served

WINDING-UP



124. If the Company shall be wound up (whether the liquidation is voluntary, under supervision, or by the Court), the liquidator may with the authority of a Special Resolution, divide among the Members in specie or kind the whole or any part of the assets of the Company and whether or not the assets shall consist of property of one kind or shall consist of properties of different kinds and may for such purpose set such value as he deems fair upon any one or more class or classes of property and may determine how such division shall be carried out as between the Members or different classes of Members. The liquidator may, with the like authority, vest any part of the assets in trustees upon such trusts for the benefit of Members as the Liquidator with the like authority shall think fit, and the liquidation of the Company may be closed and the Company Provisions relating to liquidation

dissolved, but so that no contributory shall be compelled to accept any shares in respect of which there is a liability.

INDEMNITY

125. Subject to the provisions of the Act every Director, Managing Agent, Auditor, Manager, Secretary or officer or Servant of the Company shall be entitled to be indemnified by the Company against all costs, charges, losses, expenses and liabilities incurred by him in the execution and discharge of his duties or in relation thereto.
126. No Directors, Managing Agent, Auditor or other officers of the Company shall be liable for the acts, receipts, neglects or defaults of any other Director or Officer, or for joining in any receipt or other act for conformity or for any loss or expense happening to the Company through the insufficiency or deficiency of title to any property acquired by order of the Directors for or on behalf of the Company, or for the insufficiency or deficiency or any security in or upon which any of the moneys of the Company shall be invested, or for any loss or damage arising from the bankruptcy, insolvency or tortious act of any person with whom any moneys, securities or effects shall be deposited, or for any loss occasioned by any error of judgement, omission, default or oversight on his part, or for any other loss, damages or misfortune whatsoever which shall happen in relation to the execution of the duties of his office or in relation thereto, unless the same happen through his own dishonesty.


